Food Bank, maintaining the Clothing Closet, serving at Hallowed Grounds Cafe, serving as the events coordinator for the church hosting weddings and funerals (MAKING the bride's wedding dress?!)... Char did a lot. But as her friends and family were sharing during the service last Monday, something jumped out to me: for Char it wasn't just about serving—doing the various tasks—it was the people. Char did it for the people.

Two-thousand years ago, people had to work hard and keep their heads down to avoid being criticized by religious leaders. A bad report from a rabbi about you could sink your business or cost you your job. Ancient Jews were known for their emphasis on hospitality, but there were limits: you didn't just lavish it on anyone. You saved it for family and close friends or anyone who was staying under your roof. But Jesus pushed his followers on this point, and on his final evening with his disciples when they share the Last Supper together, he makes this profound statement:

John 13:34-35³⁴ So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. ³⁵ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

One of the guests at Char's service shared with everyone how they had first come to visit Silverdale United Methodist Church many years before. Char was the first one to meet them at the door.

Char: "Are you new to Kitsap County?"

Guest: "Yep."

Char: "Do you have any family around here?"

Guest: "Nope."

Char: "Well we're your family now."

And you know what? Char was bold and prophetic in that moment: that couple became a part of the church.

There are people like Char that help us fulfill our mission of serving Jesus, loving people, and living his Word in outstanding ways over the years. Everyone talks about Ruby Langill's hugs. She and her husband Jack WERE the young adult ministry for decades. In our current hospitality squad watch Anne Shriner and how she connects with newcomers—she is a laser beam of love. Silverdale United will continue to help people in need, and we will continue to rebuild our youth and young adult ministries, while doing great

things with kids, and providing excellent music for the worship of God's people. We will meet in classrooms and homes to grow disciples on Sundays and throughout the week. Once again we will put together backpacks for children in need of school supplies. Twenty-four backpacks have been donated, but we need school supplies to fill them. Here are items needed:


- boxes of 12-24 colored pencils

Silverdale United Christmas Market is looking for vendors!


- Saturday, November 17th from 9am to 4pm.
