On January 13, our church membership voted YES on the question:

Chick-fil-A???

Do you support Silverdale United Methodist Church entering into a non-binding business relationship with Chick-fil-A? What has that meant?

In January, Brett Hall and Chris Wyatt met with our church lawyer who II contacted Chick-fil-A and let them know that we might be interested in selling or leasing them part of our property, however, a committee was being formed to evaluate our church needs. Over the course of time, our lawyer has contacted Chick-fil-A two more times and let them know that we need more time to make a decision. We do not have a deadline for a final decision and have not signed any agreement with Chick-fil-A.

II The Facility Vision and Planning Committee was formed and included interested members July 13 — Dr. Phyllis Moeller Memorial 11 and congregants. This committee met six times in February and March and did the following


- Reviewed the SUMC mission and vision statements and established a statement of work for the committee as follows: To make God's house a safe, accessible, functional, and beautiful facility worthy of our Father and inspiring people to worship and serve Him.
- Reviewed current ministries of the church and discussed which ones we might want to expand and ideas for new ministries that would support our mission and vision.
- Identified ideal facility needs for our ministries.
- Heard from a local business realtor about process IF we decided to sell part or all of our ш
 - Discussed pros and cons of selling vs. leasing part of the property.
 - Reviewed the list made by Trustees of critical repairs needed for the current buildings to stay functional—the list is long.

II In March and April the following work was also done of by committee members:

- Visited a local church who is currently rebuilding.
- Checked on county building requirements.
- Met with two local developers, Mike Brown and Rich Rucker.

II Met with local architect, Steve Rice and team, to hear about how they might work with us to look at possibilities for remodeling our current facility or rebuilding on part of our current site. In April the committee met with Architect Steve Rice and team to hear a proposal for working with SUMC. The committee then voted to request funding (up to \$25,000) through the Finance Committee and Church Council to fund predesign and development work for remodeling and/or rebuilding on our current property. The funds were approved at the May Church Council meeting.

In June, the committee met with Steve Rice and team and looked at seven conceptual designs for how the current property could be used to remodel or rebuild to meet our mission, vision and ministry needs, and meet county requirements for land use. Four concepts were...

The committee will present refined options to the congregation sometime in the fall, with at least two weeks between the presentation and a congregational vote on a final decision.

The Service of Passionate Devotion: John 21:16 By Oswald Chambers, My Utmost for His Highest, June 19

Jesus did not say to make converts to your way of thinking, but He said to look after His sheep, to see that they get nourished in the knowledge of Him. We consider what we do in the way of Christian work as service, yet Jesus Christ calls service to be what we *are* to Him, not what we *do* for Him. Discipleship is based solely on devotion to Jesus Christ, not on following after a particular belief or doctrine. "If anyone comes to Me and does not hate..., he cannot be My disciple" (Luke 14:26). In this verse, there is no argument and no pressure from Jesus to follow Him; He is simply saying, in effect, "If you want to be My disciple, you must be devoted solely to Me." A person touched by the Spirit of God suddenly says, "Now I see who Jesus is!"— that is the source of devotion.

Today we have substituted doctrinal belief for personal belief, and that is why so many people are devoted to causes and so few are devoted to Jesus Christ. People do not really want to be devoted to Jesus, but only to the cause He started. Jesus Christ is deeply offensive to the educated minds of today, to those who only want Him to be their Friend, and who are unwilling to accept Him in any other way. Our Lord's primary obedience was to the will of His Father, not to the needs of people— the saving of people was the natural outcome of His obedience to the Father. If I am devoted solely to the cause of humanity, I will soon be exhausted and come to the point where my love will waver and stumble. But if I love Jesus Christ personally and passionately. I can serve humanity. even though people may treat me like a "doormat." The secret of a disciple's life is devotion to Jesus Christ, and the characteristic of that life is its seeming insignificance and its meekness. Yet it is like a grain of wheat that "falls into the ground and dies"— it will spring up and change the entire landscape (John 12:24).
