
Coming from the South:

Take the I-15 North to the I-215 North, follow signs to I-10 East. Exit Tennessee off the I-10 East. Go left back under the freeway to Lugonia and turn right. Follow Lugonia on up the hill. Lugonia turns into Mentone Road and then into Mill Creek Road. When you see the sign on the right which says Mountain Home Creek Village you will take the first left after that sign and there will be a left turn lane. Make that left turn and after you turn you will see a big red house. Just follow the dirt road up a ways to the entrance which will be on the right.

Coming from the 210 Freeway:

Take the 210 Freeway ALMOST to the I-10 East. Exit at San Bernardino Road. Turn left and go back under the freeway. Turn right onto Tennessee/the first stop sign. Continue to Lugonia and turn left. Follow the same directions from here to Loch Leven.






Short Term Opportunities





God's Forever Faithfulness (Psalm 89:1-2; Lamentations 3:22-24)

It is God's character to be faithful! When we witness God's faithfulness, it should create a transformation in our lives and our relationships.

1. Discerning the Call (Proverbs 2:1-11)


