

GROW IN FAIL



Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18 and lasts for the 40 days leading up to Easter on April 5. This is a time for Christians to reflect, pray, fast and give. (Matthew 6:1-18) This Lent, we are challenging ourselves to search deeply within and offer ourselves in sacrifice to God. As we focus on fasting, prayer and giving, we allow ourselves to truly commit to this season of reflection and sacrifice.

Prayer: Our Sanctuary will be open every Monday in Lent (starting March 10-ending March 30) from 11 a.m. - 1 p.m. for you to pray, meditate and reflect. We have intentionally chosen to set this time during the lunch hour to allow you to skip your lunch. If you can't make it to the sanctuary we invite you to observe this time in your home or office.



Fasting: Abstaining from food has been a part of Methodism from the early beginning. John Wesley considered fasting an important part of a Christian's life. The key to fasting is to replace the time you would have spent eating with prayer and reflection. We are asking that Monday be the day you set aside as your fasting day. *You should contact your doctor before participating in a food fast.

Giving: Lent is a time to sacrificially give above and beyond what you normally offer. This can be done financially or you can take something on for Christ. You can commit to serve more than you have or in a different way than you have before.



Join us in the Sanctuary on Palm Sunday, March 29. The 9 a.m. worship will be a special celebratory worship telling the Palm Sunday story through music and readings. The 10:30 a.m contemporary worship will feature students from our Worship Arts class. Children are welcome to attend our Lenten worship services with their parents, but childcare will also be provided in Bldg B.



And it's easy to judge ourselves harshly and become discouraged. The Apostle Paul was no stranger to that feeling. Prior to writing most of the New Testament, Paul wasn't such a good guy. He was an epic failure. And through his words, we discover the encouraging truth that even when we fail, God is for US.


