

#### Construction Update - April 12

Weekly, I will be providing a summary of what has been planned on the construction project. Because we have to submit the bulletin to the printer a week ahead, there may be times where changes are made to the schedule after the bulletin submission, but the reports will be as accurate as possible. The following is what has taken place this week:

We took out the six large trees that were causing potential damage to our facilities and had the stumps ground. It effectively opened up the sightlines to the Church. The remaining trees in the parking lot were demossed only as high as the tree company's lift would take the workers. Once we are done with the roof and gutters, we will have a company demoss the trees along Highland. They are currently covered in moss, and they could also use a good cleaning.

The loan from the United Methodist Foundation was processed and approved on March 25. We are now able to start drawing down funds from the loan to pay for materials that need to be ordered. The permit for the HVAC repairs to our facilities was issued by the City of Largo in three weeks, much faster than anticipated! We were charged a nominal fee of \$10,511, which is also less than we had anticipated. This puts the pro-

ject in high gear and we are hoping to finish the project sooner than anticipated, barring any complications. The roofer will apply for the roofing permit separately. We originally thought the project could take up to seven months, but we are now hoping to be finished by the end of June in order to take advantage of increased electrical savings during the summer with the installation of our new equipment.

Starting this week (April 13), welding for the support steel for the new HVAC units will be done in the second floor ceilings of the Children's Building. New stands for condensing units are being installed and new curbs for the HVAC systems are being installed in the roof. We will begin to cut new holes in the roof for the new HVAC units and vents. This has been a busy week of planning, with supplies being delivered to be used this week. We are in the final stages of choosing a firm to refurbish the steeples, and are anticipating that work will be done on site in the next few weeks.

Watch for updates on our progress weekly. Please keep this project covered with your prayers.

Bottom Line: Before you pay back, remember you were paid for. Revenge is sweet, isn't it? Few things feel better than getting back at someone who treated you badly. Maybe you've heard you're supposed to forgive and forget, but there is just something in all of us that loves to pay others back. Of course the sweetness of the moment doesn't last. If we pay someone back, they will want to do the same to us. That's the thing about revenge, it doesn't put an end to the situation—it escalates it. But what other options do you have? If you've been hurt or attacked or humiliated, you can't just stand by and do nothing. Once again, Jesus uses the art of storytelling to address this very idea. As He introduces us to two guys, both with a debt to pay, we find that forgiveness isn't about doing nothing. It's about using your time and energy to do the only thing that can make the situation better.






Powerful Worship on Palm Sunday
