

Construction Update

This has been a busy week with good weather, and crews have been working on both sides of the street simultaneously. We are certainly making the most of our crews and their equipment, gaining the best efficiency and costs available. The old roof taken been taken off the CLEC, the felting



has been applied and shingles will start this week. Removing the old roof on the Sanctuary has begun. We're expecting that the shingled roofing on all buildings will be done prior to the end of May. You'll notice that the Steeple and the Spire atop the South Fellowship Hall have been power-washed, inspected, repaired and painted bright white. They can once again serve as a beacon to the community. The HVAC systems have been installed on top of the Sanctuary and are now working. Continued work above the Nursery and Children's Building is taking place. All HVAC on the South side of the campus will be done by the end of May, so the flat roofs can be worked on in June. Repair on the chiller system will begin in the next two weeks. This project is ahead of schedule, and we hope to take advantage of savings in electrical use this summer as a result. Thank you all for your patience when entrances are blocked or areas are roped off for safety. These inconveniences will pay great dividends as we provide for God's house. Please continue to keep the project in your prayers.

Candlelight Prayer Vigil


