

Construction Update

All of the shingled roofs have now been completed. This week, materials have been delivered for work on the flat roofs. **It's** good to know that the roofs will be water tight before storm season, which will be here soon!

Once all of the fascia work is completed, all three buildings will be power washed and the bricks sealed to help prevent water penetration through the bricks. Following the power washing, the trim on the Sanctuary, Nursery Building (Bldg B) and the Children's Building (Bldg C) will be painted with a fresh coat of white paint. The air conditioning work in the Preschool hallway serving all of the classrooms should be done this week. We will finalize




Installing HVAC on Children's Building Roof

the ordering of windows to replace the old leaky windows that no longer fully shut. New windows will help us save money on AC. They will be installed later this month.

Work on the runs to the balcony of the Sanctuary will be routed to the Connection Center (former Family Room/Parlor) so we can remove the window unit hanging outside and replace that with a piece of solid glass. We once again will be able to have a working thermostat in that room.

Work is also continuing in the CLEC. Pipes are being wrapped. This is a slow, tedious process but will be well worth it. The Prop Room, the Scout Room and the Mariposa Café have been completed and the crew is working in the Carpenter's Room and hallways. (Work will also be done in the chiller yard as they begin refurbishment of the system. The painting contractor power washed the CLEC, fixed areas where there were gouges in the sides of the building and started painting the building. It is being painted in a similar color scheme to the existing colors. They started painting in the back of the building so we could test the colors chosen. You will notice it is more tan and brown with less orange in its tone and will look sharp with the new multi-brown dimensional shingles. The trim will still be white. Once it is finished, the gutters and downspouts can be installed. Please continue to keep the project in your prayers.


