Coffee is served at 6 p.m. and discussion begins at 6:30 p.m. Kids are welcome to join their parents and hang out with the group at 6 p.m. before separating out to the Worship Arts Class at 6:30 p.m.

We discuss a different topic each week, so you can come and go as your summer schedule allows. Due to the nature of some topics discussed, we suggest that students attend our Worship Arts class.

#### Construction Update

The rainy season has definitely arrived! Several days last week, work had to stop due to strong storms. This was a short week with the 4th of July holiday so much of the week has been catch-up. While roof and painting work has been interrupted, work inside has continued to move forward. We are wasting no time. In the Christian Life Enrichment Center kitchen, the ceiling was taken down. Pipes were checked and rewrapped as needed. A new ceiling grid system was installed and new, more energy efficient lights have been installed to meet code requirements. The kitchen should be finished this week with the new lights installed and new ceiling tiles. Wrapping of pipes continues in Bldg B (Nursery).

This past week, work started in the sanctuary balcony. A new drip ceiling has been installed for ductwork. The air handler was replaced and will now feed both the balcony and the Connection Center. Soon we will take out the window unit that drips on people as they leave the west side door in the back of the sanctuary. It will be replaced with a solid piece of glass after we replace the windows in the Bldg C (Children's Building). Due to some flashing being cut on the flat roof of Bldg C at some point in the past, allowing the fasteners to attach the flat roof has been a challenge. The roofing contractor thinks they have found a good way to fasten the roof down, and weather permitting, this will be worked on this week and finalized by the end of next week. Once that is done, the gutters and downspouts can be installed. We've been anxious to get this finished to stop the water leaks.

The big boom has been here this week so the CLEC bell tower exterior could be painted, sealing it from leaking inside the walls. With the strong possibility of storms every day this week, painting will continue whenever there is time for paint to dry between storms. As a result, mornings will be very busy with painting while keeping an eye on the weather. In any cases where we are concerned about adequate paint coverage, the company has repainted those areas to assure that our exterior is sealed properly to give us the 10-15 year protection we need.

Please continue to keep this project bathed in prayer. We have been moving forward consistently and I remain convinced that it is the prayers of the faithful that have kept this project on or ahead of schedule. Keep 'em coming!


