Bottom Line: Decide today that you will learn to pray. Phones are amazing things. You can use a smart phone to take pictures, turn on your security alarm, order a latte or even talk face-to-face with someone in another country! One device works a bunch of different ways and it's awesome. But I'll bet you also know someone, maybe your grandma or her friend, who doesn't want to learn how to use new technology. They prefer for the phone to do only one thing-make calls. And that's okay, but it just feels like they're missing out. In the same way, a lot of us treat prayer like the old only-for-one-kind-of-thing telephone. We know how to ask for stuff, but we haven't learned all of the other things we can do with prayer. That's why, this week, we're going to explore four other things you can do with prayer that may surprise you. As we look at examples from Scripture of real people who really prayed this way, you may find the courage to try something new as well.
