Open Arms Resource Center

St. Paul believes we are to help our brothers and sisters when they are in need. Open Arms offers food and clothing, financial assistance for rent and utilities, and spiritual support. This ministry is currently serving about 4,000 people every month. Last year Open Arms served about 25,600 families and 59,700 individuals. This holiday season Open Arms provided turkey dinners to over 350 families and Christmas presents to over 500 children! The food and clothing from Open Arms is provided for free through the generosity of the St. Paul family and friends in the community.

How You Can Help?

Donations of dry goods, canned goods, baby items, bread, cleaning supplies, and toiletries. Gently used clothing, blankets, linens, socks, shoes, and jackets. Open Arms holds a Food Drive on the second Saturday of every month from 9 a.m. to Noon.
