Help Provide Rain Boots for Children in South Sudan

Carolyn Goodwin, a St. Paul member, recently began serving as a missionary in South Sudan, Africa. Since her arrival in Yei, Carolyn has become involved with two orphanages and is learning about what the children need to improve their

lives. One of these things is rain boots because of the long 8-9 month rainy season. Believe it or not, the rainy season in South Sudan begins in April and can extend through November. The boots are needed to help the kids get through the mud holes and protect their feet from hidden rocks, broken glass, snakes and other debris.

Carolyn has been able to locate a source in Africa that will provide the boots if we can provide the funding. It costs about \$7 to buy a pair of rain boots for one child. If you can help, place a donation in one of the rain boots located in the Connection Center or the church office. For tax-deductible donations, please make your check payable to The Mission Society with **"Carolyn Goodwin-Rain Boots"** in the memo line. Cash is also welcome, but not tax-deductible. **All proceeds will go towards the purchase of rain boots for the children.** If we raise more than is needed for the orphanages, boots will be provided to other South Sudanese children in need. 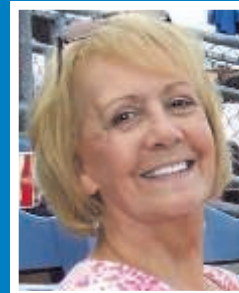
