




May Sunday Series: Super Size Me

How Church Members Can Prepare for a Sermon

When we talk about sermon preparation, we're usually talking about the number of hours the pastor needs to prepare, the research they've done, and the scriptures they've read. Those of us who will receive the message often see our role as simply "showing up." But what if church members prepared for each sermon they heard? Our roles as recipients of the Word are also crucially important, and we can all take an active role in sermon preparation. Here are a few ways each of us can actively prepare for sermons. You don't need to do all of them, but choosing a few that speak to you may help you take more away from worship each Sunday and carry that into the rest of the week.

- **Pray.** Take time during the week, Saturday night, or Sunday morning to pray that the Holy Spirit will lead the pastor in preparation and delivery of the sermon, and that God will speak to you through the message. Pray for clarity of mind and an open heart to receive the message.
- Read the Biblical text before the sermon is preached. Each week the bulletin with the order of worship and the scripture can be downloaded early on our website: stpaulumc.org. Going forward we will also include it in the weekly e-mail. If possible, read the text in advance. Read it thoroughly. Read it prayerfully.
- Take notes. Take notes during the message. You will have a greater focus and greater retention. Review the notes at least once during the next week. We also provide a weekly Growth Guide based on Sunday's message with additional scripture, challenge questions and more. If you'd like to receive it by e-mail, just fill out the Connect Card in this bulletin, or the online form on our website.
- Apply the message to your life. Ask God for discernment to help you understand how the sermon should change your life. Seek to understand the sermon not only in its biblical context, but in your life as well.
- Share "one thing" with the pastor. If you took away something significant from the sermon, share that with Pastor Bob in person, by e-mail or on Facebook. Pastors are often told "nice message" but they long to know if and how God really made a difference in the lives of church members through their words.

The preaching of God's Word is central to the life of the church. It makes sense that pastors should give it the highest priority. But doesn't it also make sense that church members should prepare as well?


GOOD NEWS
