I'd like to wish a Happy Father's Day to all the fathers, grandfathers and father-figures we have here today. We appreciate all you do!

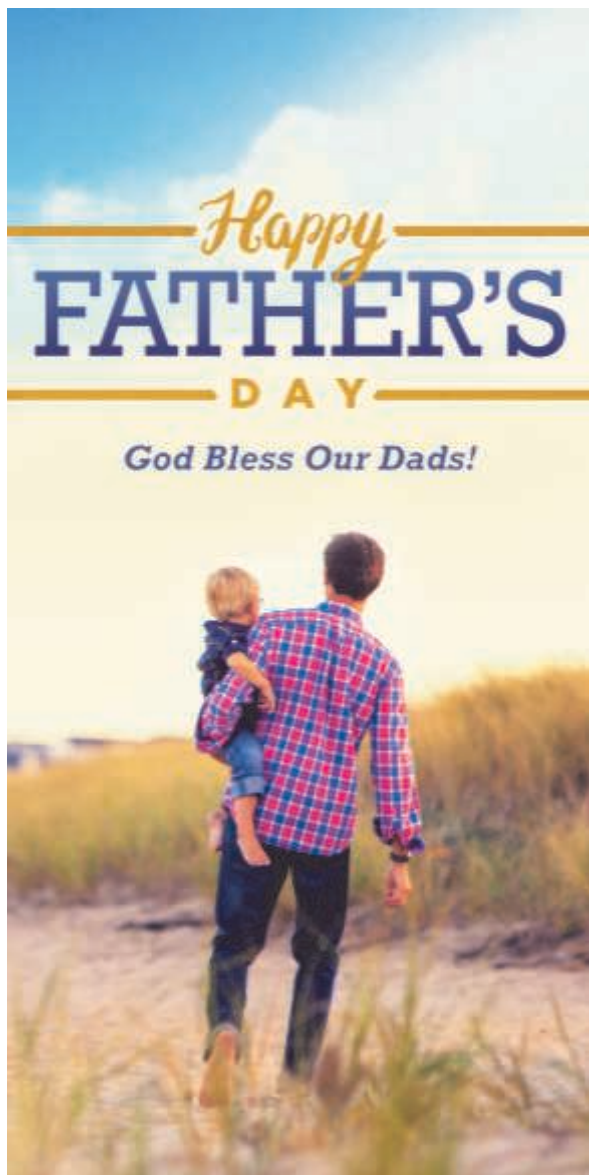

The men's Saturday morning devotional group, Soaring Eagles, are on hiatus for the summer. They will return in September.

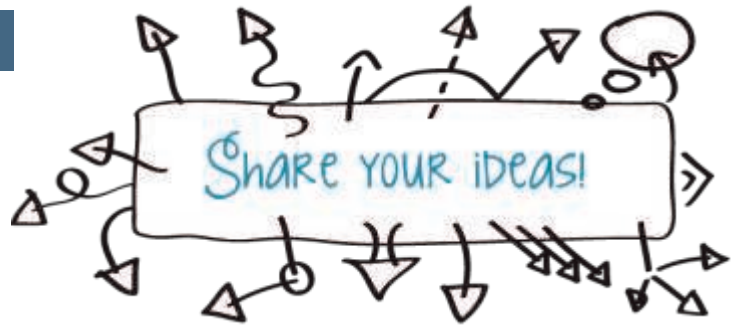


Adults Ages 18-35

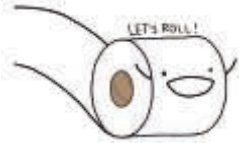

Update from Carolyn Goodwin in South Sudan

I hope this letter finds everyone in the best of health and happiness. I am doing very well. After seven months my ministry is growing. I'm working with the UMC women doing discipleship and leadership trainings in Yei state, and I have started a Bible study for women at the prison. There are several of us who go—me, a lady missionary from Church of God, and Bako and Charity from the Health Team, who interpret. There are nine women we currently visit. One just gave birth to a little girl this week. Another mamma has a two year old with her. These children will be raised in prison for as long as their mothers are incarcerated. Before meeting with the women for Bible study, we do a praise and worship session with all the inmates—about 136 people. We open with prayer and sing, bring a message, do prayer requests (which they aren't used to), and pray to close. They seem to really enjoy it, and have said it's been a blessing to them. I know it has been a blessing to me!

I want to take a minute to say thank you so much to everyone who helped organize and donate to the rain boot project! We recently had three snake bites in the area and an eight year old boy died. So, I thank you

for these desperately needed gifts that will help protect the kids! Because you donated so generously we were able to provide not only rain boots, but also a pair of sturdy closed toed dress shoes. We gathered up bags full of shoes and rain boots, and then brought the sales people, boots and shoes to the children so they could be sure to get shoes that fit. It was an amazing process, and it worked. I can't tell you how excited the kids were to get something new that they needed. Take a look at a few photos of the kids receiving their shoes and boots. You have made many children very happy and protected.

I want to thank everyone again for your support. I'm sure things wouldn't be going so well for me here without it. The prayers keep me strong in faith and courage, and financial support just keeps me here. As the ministry is expanding, more needs are exposed and the financial impact increases as well.
