
Volunteer

Mary Williams, long-time friend and attendee of St. Paul, has been using her God-given talents of woodworking for the benefit of children and adults throughout Pinellas County and beyond. Mary became reacquainted with the art of woodworking about 18 months ago, soon after the death of her husband John. Prompted by The Holy Spirit, Mary began creating wooden characters. Mary begins her creation process with a two foot by four foot piece of plywood. Out of the board she cuts 60 to 65 various characters and objects, which she then paints and decorates.

Once the character is created, the true blessings take place. To date Mary has made about 2,500 creations, which she has donated to several church ministries and Pinellas County organizations including Stephen Ministry, SonKissed Preschool, VBS, The Children's Center, area church schools and The Pinellas County Sheriff's Department. In addition, her creations have found new homes in the hands of shut-ins and those in hospitals. Not only has Mary blessed hundreds of people locally, but many out-of-state as well. She has received many appreciation letters written by children and adults who have received her creations. What a creative way to share Christ's love!


