

Bottom Line: The Bible can make your life better. Ask anyone what they think about the Bible, and you'll most likely get a lot of different answers. While a lot of people would probably say it's an important book, they might also say it's old or long or too hard to understand. 




Half Truths Study—Mariposa Cafe

Grief Share Support Group Wednesdays at 6 p.m. starting September 14 Required Workbook: \$18

GriefShare is a weekly grief support group that will meet in the Ignite Room (202) of the Christian Life Enrichment Center starting September 14. The group is open to anyone over the age of 18 who has suffered the death of a loved one, and offers an opportunity to share the journey through grief with others who understand how you feel. All of the group leaders have suffered a loss of their own and have been where you are now. Weekly meetings include informational videos from grief recovery experts, small group discussion and support, and a workbook with personal study exercises and more. The cost of the workbook is \$18. The group will last 13 weeks, and you do not have to attend every week, just come when you can. This group is open to the public, so if you know of anyone who is dealing with grief, please pass on the group information to them.

does? Stephen Ministry is a Christ-based ministry with a belief that, while our Stephen Ministers are called to be the hands and heart of Jesus here on earth, only God can heal our wounded hearts. So the logo is a perfect symbol of what Stephen Ministry means and what it does!

### The Stephen Ministry Logo:

- Shows the cross of Jesus which symbolizes the wholeness we receive through Christ.
- The circle represents God's unending love.
- The broken person stands behind the cross showing the brokenness of our lives.
- The whole person stands in front of the cross because it is through the cross of Jesus that we are made whole again.


