SECOND ANNUAL AUCTION TO BENEFIT ST. PAUL: OCT. 2



Update on Missionary Carolyn Goodwin

Carolyn Goodwin, a St. Paul member who has been serving as a Mission Society missionary in South Sudan has been displaced by the violence there. She reports that by God's grace she and the other Methodist missions folk she has been working with in Yei are safe. They have been staying in Kenya for the past several weeks but on Wednesday, August 24, Carolyn and the others left for Entebbe, Uganda to meet with people from the FS South Sudan United Methodist Church. From Entebbe, Carolyn tells us they are driving to Arua, Uganda to the refugee camp where some of the Yei camp staff and children are. They will volunteer to help at this refugee camp, then if the Lord permits, they hope to go back to Yei for a short trip to take care of a few things at the hospital and the prison where some of their mission work was being done. Carolyn will be using some of the money that remained after providing shoes to the orphanage in Yei to provide food for the children in the Arua refugee camp.

Please continue to pray for peace and reconciliation for South Sudan and for the safety and protection of Carolyn and the other **mission folks who were spreading God's love to the South Suda**nese people in Yei and surrounding villages.
