

At Open Arms she received food, as well as some clothing. She called to say thank you and tell us how much she appreciated the help she received. Every day Open Arms is reaching hundreds of people just like this young woman, not only giving them food and other necessities, but also letting them know that they are not alone. God loves them, and we do too!

South Sudan Update Carolyn Goodwin, a St. Paul member who has been serving as a missionary with the Mission Society in South Sudan has sent us an update from Uganda, where many have First group of children evacuated fled during the ongoing violence in South Sudan. She has some good news to report! Some of the children from the orphanages were evacuated on July 20, but many others had been stuck in a dangerous area. They were finally able to bring the rest of the children from children's homes

across the border this month. She tells us getting the second group out safely was nothing short of a miracle. The UN is trying to keep everyone organized and disciplined in the refugee camps. They have distributed necessities like saucepans, blankets, and more to the people who are coming with just the shirts on their backs. There are still a lot of needs, and the processing and transition from the time of crossing the border to getting to a camp can be days or even weeks. Please pray for the hundreds who are crossing daily.

Carolyn writes, "The first time we went out to the camp to greet the children they were obviously disturbed with very serious and tired faces. By the time we left, there was laughter and lots of smiles. I learned in Stephen Ministry that sometimes the best thing to do for someone is just be there. It was obvious when we left a difference was made. God has answered my "what to do" question. Seeing those children smile has convinced me the focus of my ministry is to minister to the refugees of South Sudan any way I can. Then when it is time to return to Yei, I pray the Lord will allow me to be with them to help them go home."

Carolyn is planning to be in Florida on October 2 as part of her furlough. If you would like to talk to Carolyn when she's here about the South Sudanese or how you can help the refugees you can e-mail her to set up a time at goodwin.carolyn99@gmail.com. She is happy to speak with individuals or groups like Sunday School classes or Source Groups.
