## LVING HEARTS MEMORIAL FOOD MINISTRY

#### Volunteers Needed for a New Ministry

When families are suffering with grief over the loss of a loved one, there is a need for the church family to rally around them and care for them. One way to do this is to offer the family a reception on the day of the memorial service. A gathering of friends and family after a memorial service is another step in the grieving process and recovery. Providing food helps the family to feel that their church family is with them, supporting them at a very difficult time. In 2017, St. Paul will begin a new ministry called the "Loving Hearts Memorial Food Ministry" to serve grieving families in this way. Dede VanHooser will be the ministry's coordinator, but she will need lots of help! We are asking for volunteers from our Martha Ministry teams and from the church membership in general to take part in providing this means of support to grieving families.

#### How will the ministry work?

Because food is being provided by the volunteers at no cost to the grieving family, we will provide the family with three choices of menu:

- Desserts and Drink (Water, Coffee or Tea)
- Finger Sandwiches and Salads
- "Bring a Dish" Pot Luck This would be open to the Loving Hearts group as well as friends and family of the grieving family

Paper goods, plastic table cloths, etc., would be provided by the Loving Hearts Food Ministry. We will limit the ministry to small memorial receptions of approximately 50 persons or less. Larger receptions would, in most cases, be referred to a caterer. The memorial receptions would be held at the church.

#### How often will volunteers be needed?

We can't predict how many memorials St. Paul will host any given year, but for reference, so far in 2016, St. Paul has hosted 14 memorial services. Because of the nature of the event, volunteers should be aware that there probably would be a short notification period for food preparation.

**If you would like to join in the "**Loving Hearts Memorial **Food Ministry"** beginning in January 2017 and be willing to provide food for memorial receptions or if you have questions, please fill out the Connect Card, call or stop by the church office.
