

Bottom Line: Relationship > Rules

When it comes to rules, most people fall into one of two categories: rule-keepers or rule-breakers. It seems like the two couldn't be more different, but, believe it or not, there's one thing both types of people have in common: they're always focused on the rules. And sometimes there's no place we see this more than at church. Whether you're a rule breaker or a rule keeper, it's easy to become so concerned with what you're doing right-or not doing right-that the rules become the point. But when we make the rules the primary focus of our faith, we tend to lose sight of what's most important: a relationship. When God invites us to be in with Him, He's not inviting us to live a rules-focused life, but rather a relationship-focused life with Him. And as we look at how that truth impacted someone close to Him, we'll see that when we shift our focus from rules to relationship we'll begin to truly step into the life Jesus called us to live.

Thank You from the Sabal Palms Children's Center

Dear St. Paul United Methodist Church.

Words cannot express the tremendous positive impact the Handicapable Ministry and Horton Townes have had on the residents of Sabal Palms, especially the children and young adults. For over a year Horton, Renee and several members of the Handicapable group visit Sabal Palms Children's Center every month and conduct a "Pizza and Prayer" worship service with a sing along, special prayer time and a short but meaningful lesson, appropriate for our residents' abilities and interests. Our "Pizza and Prayer Service" is the first designated church service we have ever had at the Children's Center. The children and teens look forward to the event every month. Andrea and Donny from Handicapable do a great job helping Horton lead the service and their involvement provides a great opportunity for socialization for the young adults who reside at Sabal Palms. It is through these monthly gatherings Fanny and Alyssa, who are both six years old, have acquired a valuable life skill; they have learned how to pray. When Horton brought Handicapable to Sabal Palms over a year ago, Fanny and Alyssa could barely sit through the service, now they look forward to it every month. At prayer time both girls now know to be calm, close their eyes and bow their heads. Words do not convey the profound impact this has had on their lives.
