

They also recommend compensation, travel, housing, and other financial matters to the church council through the finance team. They are responsible for policies on hiring, evaluation, promotion, retirement and dismissal. 


#### Ash Wednesday Worship

Dorcas Sewing Circle 2016 Report In 2016 a small group of United Methodist Women, members of the DORCAS Sewing Circle, provided 300 lap robes, walker bags, bibs and comfort pillows to 11 nursing

homes. They made 130 Ditty Bags that the UMW filled in September for the homeless. Check page 8 for more info about the Ditty Bag project. They also made 150 articles of clothing for children that were given to four local pregnancy centers and pre-schools, as well as to children in Haiti through For Haiti with Love. What an impact they are making for the Lord!
