The people selected will receive a letter in the mail from our auditor, Kimberly Ford, CPA, asking you to confirm that you received a copy of your statement and that it is correct. If you get one of these letters, please respond as directed in the letter. We will announce the outcome of the audit when it is finalized in March.

Bottom Line: Following Jesus starts with a step. When faced with a decision in your life, have you ever stopped to ask yourself this question: is it worth it or not? Sometimes a relationship with Jesus feels just like this, too. We know what God says about following Him—what choices we'll have to make, habits we might have to change, things we might have to give—and we find ourselves wondering if it will be worth it in the end. As we wrap up this series we'll learn from Matthew, a tax collector that had a lot to lose, that taking that first step to follow God is always worth it in the end.

Valentine's Social Raises \$1,400
