



Sunday Youth Group TONIGHT: HIGH SCHOOL ONLY

Middle schoolers had a retreat this weekend, so tonight's student ministry is high school only. We'll have dinner and games, then watch the movie *Priceless*.



Inspired by true stories, *Priceless* is a powerful drama/thriller about James Stevens who, after the tragic death of his wife and losing custody of his little girl, is at the darkest crossroad of his life. Angry, desperate, and unable to hold down a job, he agrees to drive a truck on a one-time trip cross country for cash -- no questions asked. But when he discovers what he is delivering, he is compelled to save two beautiful and frightened sisters who are unaware of the danger that awaits them. Can love, strength, and faith redefine his past and change the course of his future? This unlikely hero risks it all to save these women, confront the forces that oppose him and ultimately discover the life he was meant to live." The movie It's rated PG-13 and deals with the adult theme of human trafficking, but is done very tastefully and without any onscreen sexual activity. Following the movie we'll have discussion.
