

Join us in the LuAnne Willey Fellowship Hall anytime from 6-7:30 p.m. on Maundy Thursday to walk a prayer labyrinth and visit stations related to communion and remembering our baptisms.



A prayer labyrinth is not a maze, but a path to walk with reflection points and scripture to help guide your prayers. Walking toward the center, we pray over our sins and burdens. In the center, we symbolically let go of whatever it is we're carrying, and empty ourselves before God. Take as much time as you need in the center to pray, listen, and receive whatever God has for you. As we walk back out of the labyrinth, we focus our prayers on how we will reach out to the rest of the world.

For those who have trouble walking, we will provide "finger labyrinths" so you can "walk the labyrinth" while remaining seated. You will also be able to take part in the stations.

To preserve the labyrinth, please wear or bring a pair of socks with you. We will provide shoe covers for those who do not have socks.



We cannot fully experience the celebration and joy of Easter without first experiencing the suffering and darkness of Good Friday. Join us in the sanctuary as we remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for us with a reflective time of worship led by our unplugged Praise Band.


IGNITE: Young Adults & Young Professionals

Each year we have an external auditor do a detailed review of the year's finances to ensure accuracy and that all financial procedures are followed properly. This year the results of CPA Kimberly Ford's audit were:

- All financials are accurate and detailed
- All financial personnel have strong understanding of financials
- Segregation of duties and internal controls are in full compliance

Once again this year we received a "No Comments Audit," which means that all policies were followed, all money was properly handled, all bank and investment accounts were balanced each month, and balances were properly reported. Our entire church staff is part of why we received a successful audit, but special thanks go to our bookkeeper Pam Tribbie, our previous financial secretary Mary Vaughn and current financial secretary Sharon Zimmerman, and our Executive Director of Church Administration, Arch Johnston for ensuring all money given to the church has been handled properly with diligence and great care.
