Here I am after twelve months as Senior Pastor at Wayside. In the spirit of the "Book of Thanks" the Generosity Committee coordinated, here are a few thoughts on my gratitude as this first year concludes.

First, I am grateful to God for the spirit of Wayside that longs to fulfill God's calling. This summer, as I met with the team writing the new mission statement, I recognized early in that group differences of theological emphasis and different streams of associations and history within the church. I wondered if we could pull off writing a concise statement, and at times, it seemed doubtful! But each time we met the group recommitted to the task with love for Christ, the church, and each other. The team would tell you that there came an 'aha' moment when we all realized that there was a phrase we all felt positive about, and that grabbed our focus and united the effort. I know, it seems like a small thing, but this was only one moment, albeit an important one, that embodies a spirit here that is strong.

Second, I am grateful to God for Wayside's commitment to share the building for the good of the community. It is a pretty big imposition to open the door weekly to a group of nearly 100 people who are not members, but you do it. You welcome the "Glad You Are Here" AA group each Monday evening. This is an important meeting for the people who participate, and having a sense that they are welcomed and appreciated is an encouragement to them. Our participation in supporting the recovery community is a sign of having a heart that is in the right place. Healing happens here, and I am grateful that Wayside makes space for it. I am grateful when I hear members wonder how else Wayside might use buildings and grounds to serve and help the community and make known the love of Christ.

Finally, I am grateful for the ways you have accepted me as your Senior Pastor. Thank you for listening to my preaching, receiving my pastoral care, and responding to my leadership. I am grateful for Keith and Dawn, both of whom have been great partners this year, a great help to me. Their ministries provide important continuity for the church and they willingly innovate with me as we move into the future. Thanks, too, to Karen Rae Pastewka, Karen Shor, and David Sickles, each a member of a team that works the many pieces and parts daily to keep the mission moving forward. I am grateful to God, whose faithfulness is revealed in so many ways and among so many people.

## ON THE TRUSTEES' PLATE



This is the first of the Trustees monthly newsletter updates to the congregation.

Mike Reed retired from his duties as Wayside Treasurer effective September 30, 2016. Vanessa Fremer has graciously agreed to take over the position of Treasurer. The Trustees thank Mike for his years of service as Treasurer.

The most pressing issue facing the Trustees over the summer has been the wall of the stairwell which goes from ground level on the west side of the kitchen down to the basement of the church where the Utility Room is located. We have been

monitoring the condition of the wall since early in the year and were very concerned that the wall could collapse. We solicited input from a professional engineer and local contractors who had the capability to do the needed work. At the September meeting the Trustees voted to award a contract to local company BSI in the amount of approximately \$25,000 to replace the wall. A professional engineer will certify the work, which has already begun.

The Treasurer's report was discussed at length. We have approximately \$453,000 in assets and \$70,000 in debt. Our cash is diminishing, as we are approximately \$26,000 behind in pledges year-to-date. We expect our year-end budget to be approximately \$40,000 in deficit. The Trustees have opened a \$100,000 line of credit to be used to pay current and upcoming expenses and not resort to selling assets out of our investment portfolio.

Upcoming major maintenance issues that need to be addressed are sealing and painting the parking lot and driveways and cleaning and waterproofing the exterior brick of the sanctuary, education wing and the offices.

Other issues discussed were installing a handrail to the pulpit, finding a more secure method to attach the pew candle holders, a programmable lock for the Fellowship Hall door, fall grounds cleanup, the contract for snow removal, evaluating alternative means of pledging, remembering Wayside in wills and estate planning and putting a new sign on the northwest corner of 12th and Asbury.

Amid our own special celebrations, however, do we ever wonder how others less fortunate celebrate Thanksgiving? Are there some who do not have Thanksgiving dinner at all? Sure, many of us cast fleeting thoughts in that direction. We may even wish there was something we could do to help make someone else's Thanksgiving dinner a little more special, a little more plentiful, a bit more peaceful. But what could we do??? 





If everyone could give just a little more, we would have a tremendous abundance that will allow us to continue to thrive and expand the mission of Wayside. If you have not pledged in the past, please consider doing so this year. Even if you are not sure of your upcoming financial challenges for 2017, take a small step of faith and know God will provide.

In addition to considering financial support for the coming year, this is also good time to pray about how you might give God more of your time and talents. Consider investment into your spiritual development by committing more time to prayer or attending a bible study. Also consider seeking out volunteer opportunities or plan on participating in more of the mission opportunities of Wayside for 2017. Wayside has more opportunities than ever and this is something for which we can be excited and grateful.

## **BUDGET BYTES FROM YOUR BUDGET COMMITTEE**

Short and sweet and to the (exclamation) point:

- ◆ 2016 pledges aren't quite as far behind as reported last month: in September we brought in \$34,583.00 compared to our expected \$26,314.45, so thanks to those folks who helped to make that happen. However, year-to-date we are still \$17,792.75 in the red for anticipated pledge income. Let's all try to get up to date with our pledged contributions!
- Our per capita receipts were budgeted at \$7,500 to help cover the \$16,520 due the PCUSA in 2016. To date we have received \$7,418.00 from our members, so if you haven't sent in your \$30 per confirmed member contribution, please do so before the end of the year!
- Unless we receive a tremendous response from the congregation in November and December, we currently project that Wayside will end the year with a **deficit of \$40,000.00**. The wee bit of "good" news is that we originally projected and budgeted a deficit of **\$47,269.90**. The not -so-good news is that we will end the year with a deficit at all, and a deficit of this magnitude is simply not sustainable in the long run!

Waysiders, we seek the help of each and every one to address the above issues. The projected deficit is very serious but with prayer and God's help, it is not insurmountable!!!
