Katherine is a stay at home mom and wants to finish her cosmetology degree someday.

Before joining Habitat the dream of owning their own home seemed far off. Their faith is a big part why they stay so positive. They are eager to learn from others and when asked what they have

gained from Habitat they said "stability, networking, life skills and providing a great example for our kids."
