Spiritual Nurture and Education (SN&E)

AN IMMERSION EXPERIENCE: "STORIES FROM THE EAST"

July 21-23, rising ninth graders through high school graduates are invited to an experience like no other here in Erie. Our mission trip this year will be in our hometown. As we would in other cities, our time will include service projects, times to reflect, and the meeting of new people. Unlike some of our other trips, there will be a more visceral experience of homelessness and poverty in our own backyard.

We thank Colin Hurley for the roots of this program. He has designed similar weekends for students at Mercyhurst University. On Friday night July 21, the Immersion Team will enjoy the hospitality of Mercyhurst North East. Saturday July 22 will include service work for ServeErie, interviews of homeless individuals and a walking experience of the downtown. Saturday the group will stay at the Kids Café. Sunday July 23 will be worship and conversation with Rev. Dr. Charles Mock's congregation, Community Baptist Church, on German Street.

The Outreach Committee has underwritten the weekend so the cost per family will only be \$50 per youth. A completed form and payment will hold a place for those who want to go.
