It's 3:30 a.m. and the night is sleepless. My eyes sting and eyelids feel so very heavy. I hunger for my comfy pink rose bed and try one more time to see if I can sleep there. No luck. It's too uncomfortable and hard to breathe when lying down. You see, I have been sitting up to sleep for the past four months in a chair that is now becoming a torture chamber to me allotting me two to three hours of sleep at a time before my back or neck aches or limbs become restless. I think about the others I know who are suffering with cancer and wonder how they are doing tonight.

I pray, I ask the Lord for mercy... for His help. I wonder what I am supposed to learn; how I am to accept this as His follower. My mouth drools as I look at my once comfortable bed and I hunger for rest. I remember a time when I would stretch out, welcome sleep and drift off into oblivion. Now it seems a million miles away from my reality. I feel the cancer within, the pain I can't escape unless through narcotics. How are my counterparts; what are they doing to find rest? The others I have witnessed in the congregation or chemo lab as they courageously allow these lethal liquids into their diseased bodies, hoping for a cure and a return to health.

I can't help but remember what it was like before this cancer invasion. How simple life was with its "problems." How I long for that time. To run late; to worry about bills; to be tired from a good day's work. To fall into my bed and relax at the end of the day. How I want to tell you to cherish your loved ones and health and let nothing... NOTHING get to you. Be grateful, give thanks and never let a day go by without rejoicing that you can crawl into your bed! To love deeply those in your life; to help others in need; to be God's light in what can be a dark world. To do your best; be your best; go out of your way to let people know how much you love them.

My friends tell me of their day. Running to work; problems they face; things they are trying to get done at home. They are all running here and there and I wish my life was like that again. Just to go to the market; work; make dinner and take care of chores that seem so difficult now. If only I could be back in the routine of life! Making copies, answering the church phone; tending to your needs. I'd be the happiest most satisfied employee on the face of the earth. I'd skip to work every day! I'd hug you all relentlessly and I would care about you more profoundly than ever before. I beg the Lord for that chance!

So why am I telling you all my woes today? I don't need sympathy. I want you to learn from what I am going through. Love each other; be your best; don't let stupid, meaningless stress stop you from being God's light in a dark world. Reach out to those you love, make a special dinner for them, just because you can. Enjoy your health. Drink deeply the benefits of that tremendous gift. Treasure it, respect it and do everything you can to keep it. Stretch out in your bed; enjoy taking a deep breath. Run if you can, skip to work and be grateful for it all. It all can be taken away so quickly. So what have I learned? What has the Lord taught me?

First and foremost: Health is such a precious gift. Every moment of health should be cherished. If you can get to work; run errands, take a breath without pain you are blessed beyond measure. Thank God every minute of every day! If in ill health, be grateful for the time you were healthy. Learn the lessons of gratitude even in the light of trial.

Second: Love those around you. You may not be here tomorrow to do so. I think of my son, Chris, and how precious he is to me. I want to see him

marry; I long to see my grandchildren. Will I get that chance? I honestly don't know. Every day with our love ones is a great gift, not to be taken lightly. Let go of anger, resentment and anything that stands in your way of loving deeply those in your life. Get over crap that keeps you from truly appreciating those around you. Love them with your whole heart and let your love be known. Don't let anger stand in your way... forgive anyone and everyone. That was Jesus' message and now I profoundly see why.

Third: No material thing on the face of the earth is worth getting your panties in a bunch over. At this juncture in my life, I look around at all my "stuff," and wondered why I hauled it home. There was so much more I could have done with my treasure. Sure a comfy home is sweet and stuff can make a cozy environment... but really... I wonder where it will all go once I'm gone. I think about taping names of people who may enjoy my junk so they go to good homes once I go home to the Lord. But honestly, I could care less about any of it now. I just want to be healthy! I think of all the time I wasted longing for a home of my own and now I realize my real home is with the Lord... this is all so temporary. I remember losing my house when my husband died. I dreamed of writing a best seller and would pour over house plans thinking someday I would be able to build my own home and live happily ever after. Little did I know, my happily ever after was in my little family and health. What a waste it was to dream of a house... my focus should have been on serving the Lord and just being with my little son! I remember going to a memorial and everyone remembered how this man fussed over his home... that's what he was known for and that was precisely what he left behind. Isn't there so much more we can be doing with our time and talent? Helping those in need; reaching out to those we love?

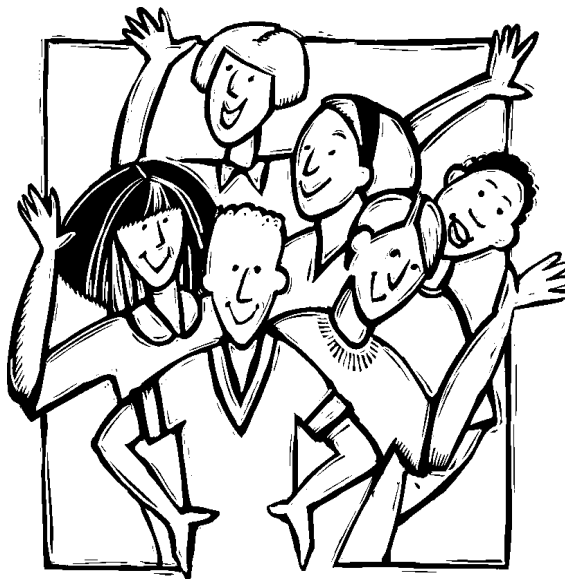

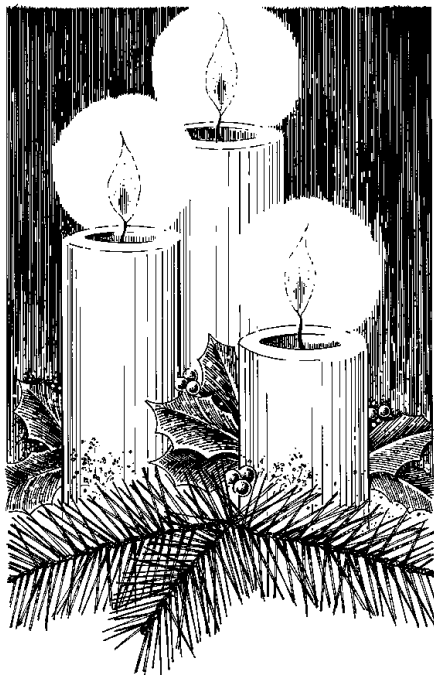
