

Rome, we know from history, was a great and mighty empire who ruled with an iron hand for hundreds of years. The thing that is so impressive about Rome was the longevity of the empire. When we dig into the reasons why that might have been we find several ideas; one such idea is that everyone swore allegiance to the Emperor.

We do not like to think of one person owning another but, in essence, it was like Caesar owned the citizens of Rome. Their identity, who they were as a person, was all tied to Caesar and the values of Rome.

When you joined the army you would stand in front of either Caesar or some image of Caesar and swear your allegiance to Caesar and Rome in the Sacrament Ceremony of joining the army.

Caesar also would teach some of the people his ecclesia - the ways and values of Rome. So when another country or a new territory was conquered the ecclesia, who held to the Roman values, would move in and settle in the new territory to teach the people there how to be a Roman, by adapting and holding on to Roman values.

So how does that affect us? Jesus came during the time of the Roman empire. We notice how Jesus called his disciples his ecclesia and He asked them to go to the nations and tribes of the world with the message of the Good News of Salvation, to teach the values of His Kingdom. Each and every day we take the values of Christ's Kingdom to work or school with us.

Also for us here at Community, we celebrate the Sacrament of Communion as a weekly reminder to us of the allegiance we gave to Christ way back when. I trust for you that each and every week as you hold the communion elements it's a reminder that you have a Savior and a leader in your life who loves you. One who is faithful to you. One who has called you to own His values of forgiveness, generosity, service and love for others. We, at times, need this weekly reminder that we serve as the ecclesia of Christ in our world & culture of 2017.
