Our own Scout Troop 56 has been a part of our youth program for almost as long as we've been a church -- over fifty years (Elwin & Ivy Spray). The youth have carried the St. Andrew name in local parades and events, and to camping trips all around our region, and also farther away into Kentucky, West

Virginia, the Florida Keys and New Mexico's Philmont. Our Troop 56 is now generally boys 11 to 17, but we also have an older age program – a Venturing Crew 56 – which is open to both girls and boys – and has also done treks in New Mexico – but we have several girls who are seeking to join the Scout troop when that process is allowed in February of next year. The Boy Scout concept is that the unit is owned by the sponsor. St Andrew thus owns Scout Troop 56 and Venturing Crew 56. Cub Scout Pack 56 (age level is pre-kindergarten boys and girls) is sponsored by the elementary school, and they hold small group meetings (Cub Dens) in our classrooms. Girls Scouts, where each of the age groups is considered a "community" troop, also use our classrooms.

Our Scout units generally support themselves, with our Scout Troop 56 having a major fundraising project of Christmas tree and wreath sales after Thanksgiving

As you look at the gardening shed out by the back parking lot, know that its completion was part of a youth project initiated by our own Ryan Smith as part of his earning the Scout Eagle rank. Driving into Bellbrook? - the welcome signs were a Troop 56 project. Other community service projects are regularly completed by Scout Troop 56 and Crew 56 -- and Pack 56 and Girl Scout troops – as part of the Scouting commitment for "giving back to the community."

Talk to us about Scouting! Although many of us in the congregation have been involved in the Scouting movement, the following are the most knowledgeable about our St. Andrew Scouts: Harry Michaels, Jeff Smith, Molly Schwartz, and Elwin Spray – and always, Pastor Lilanthi. Elwin Spray
