At the cross...

What does the cross mean to you? When did the cross have significance for your faith journey? We have all heard the meaning of the cross for our salvation. We know that the shed blood of Christ was the ransom paid for our sins, which gives us the hope of mercy and grace and the promise of life eternal.

But what do you recall about the words of Jesus from the cross? What meaning does the last words of Jesus have for our lives today? Often when someone is dying we want to pay attention to their last words—we hang on to them, as a means of hope.

Come and hear the words of Jesus from the cross and discover healing for your wounds during this season we call LENT. A period of forty days prior to Easter Sunday when we take time to reflect on our mortality, our faith journey and prepare for the hope of the resurrection.

Be sure to participate fully in worship - where you will encounter people who were near the cross. Come to one of the studies either on Wednesday or Sunday evening at 6:30 p.m. when we explore these final words of Jesus with author Adam Hamilton. You do not need anything but to come with an open spirit.

We hope to have a book "Grace from the Cross" by Kyle Idleman also on the final words of Jesus, available for each family to pick up on Ash Wednesday (March 6 at 7:00 p.m.). You are invited to read one chapter each week and come pre-prayered for worship and life transformation.

Max Lucado said "God loves you just the way you are but loves you too much to leave you that way. He wants you to be Just like Jesus. " let us become more like Jesus during this Holy Season.
