Dear St. Andrew Voters,

As many of our Beavercreek families are aware, Beavercreek City Schools will place two separate and equally important levies on the May 7 ballot for your consideration.

The first levy is an Operating Levy that is used to fund day-to-day operations such as transportation costs, utilities, classroom supplies, salaries. Important information about this levy is:

- 6.15 mills
- \$11.4 million generated per year
- \$215 (\$17.92 per month) for every \$100k of property valuation
- Not permanent, renewable every 5 years

The second levy is a Permanent Improvement Levy is used for capital improvement projects, maintenance and repairs of school property and certain equipment items that are designed to last five years or more. For example, these funds can purchase technology, heating and air conditioning systems, roofs or other facility upgrades. Ohio law prevents these funds from being used on staff salaries or benfits.

Information that is important to know about this levy is:

- 1.0 mills (collecting at .45 mills)
- Originally passed in 1989
- Generates approximately \$861,000 per year
- The passage of this levy will not raise your taxes
