Sermon Based Questions

Truly Encountering Jesus Leads to Return Encounters Luke 2:8-20, Luke 17:11-19

- 1. What made you walk into a church for the first time? Or if you grew up in the church but left it for a long period of time, what were you seeking that prompted you to walk through the door of a church again?
- 2. What first attracted you to Jesus? Were you seeking Him or something from Him?
- 3. What brought you here to BRC? What prompted you to return a second time, a third time, etc?
- 4. How have you encountered Jesus here? How has your encounters with Him led to return encounters?
- 5. Can anyone relate to the shepherds in the Luke 2 passage? In what way(s)?
- 6. Can anyone relate to the Samaritan leper in the Luke 17 passage? In what way(s)?
- 7. Can anyone relate to the other 9 lepers who received much from Jesus but did not return to thank Him and praise Him?
- 8. In what ways is BRC doing a good job in helping seekers encounter Jesus and also prompting return encounters as well?
- 9. In what ways can we improve in this area and be a church that is more "sensitive" to those who are "seeking" Christ?
