Researchers estimate between 21 million and 46 million people are forced into the sex trade or dangerous, dirty, and demeaning work, producing cheap goods such as the ones listed at right.

OUR WORLD IS BROKEN. BUT WE ARE NOT POWERLESS.

The past 6 years of Freedom Sunday offerings have raised \$800,000+ to help:

- ▶ children at ICCM hostels in Thailand and the Philippines
- ▶ survivors at Eden's Glory, a restoration home in Illinois
- ▶ migrants in Taiwan, vulnerable women in Athens, Roma girls in Bulgaria, and more.

This year, funds will be given to the following three projects, with a portion going to the Set Free Movement for oversight:



300,000+ children in Haiti work as unpaid domestic servants in a culturally acceptable system of slavery known as "restavek".

ICCM and Restavek Freedom will train teachers, pastors, church members and parents in a 12-week course to empower them to address child slavery. The project will reach all Free Methodist churches and schools in Haiti.



Children are amongst the most vulnerable to slavery in the Philippines.

Filipino boys and girls as young as 2 and 3 are sexually exploited online through cyberporn, a billion-dollar industry. Our team is training pastors, churches, and youth to be compassionate and informed responders to human trafficking.



Between 50-90% of trafficked children in the U.S. were once in the foster care system.

Our team in Seattle cares for foster children and supports foster parents and social welfare workers. In 2018, they will host a conference for teen foster care girls to cultivate spiritual growth and self-esteem and connect them to mentoring relationships.
