A quick word on temptation

1. Precisely when a certain level of spiritual maturity seems to have been attained
or some victory has occurred, temptation comes more <u>strongly</u> .

- 2. Every temptation begins in the mind.
- 3. The enemy's names describe his tactics.

The Nature of Sin

- 1. If you are trapped in sin, it's because you chose to be there.
- If you are a follower of Jesus Christ, you have a <u>new</u> nature.
- ⊕ But you still have what the Bible calls <u>flesh</u> sinful desires, lusts, misguided passions, self-centeredness and you will fight that flesh until the day you die.
- [⊕] There are two <u>warring</u> factions: your new nature that desires to do life God's way, and your flesh that lusts.
- ♣ And we choose the winner by whom we <u>rely</u> upon.

2.	When you are caught in your sin, that's mercy.	
Ŷ	Being caught in your sin is the chance to avoid <u>death!</u>	
3. For one in the stranglehold of sin, the big problem is not the act of sin itself; the big problem is that there is something taking <u>God's</u> place.		
÷	A person in the stranglehold of sin has this as his big problem: looking to some person or something to find security and <u>significance</u> .	
t	No matter what sin stronghold we have, we have it because we are trying to substitute something for God	
Out of Sin's Stranglehold		
1. You are spiritually bankrupt without Jesus' power <u>applied</u> to your life. And until you apply His power, sin will always be your master.		
2. Our tools for defeating temptation and sin are <u>Scripture</u> and the <u>Holy Spirit</u> .		

♥ Sin has no intrinsic power over a believer; it only has granted power.

 $\ \ \$ For the believer, sin has no power of its own – <u>Jesus</u> broke that power.
