Living Changes

Most people I know, maybe because I related and was drawn to them, disliked change. Even the suggestion of change with good intentions and goals triggered a sudden involuntary response of repulsion. Be assured, I have known others who embraced change and have gone about it with staggering aplomb and joyful glee (my mother). Ushering in the coming seasons by decorating the household with special effects in anticipation conjures up an aliveness and readiness for what the future holds. There is no dreadfulness and hesitation to cloud and darken (my father).

Accordingly, the past verb tenses used above illustrate my early formative years of learned family standard operating procedures. Learned early basic skills reflect the nature of our viewpoints and form our perspectives. These guide us in how we see the world and how we interact in it. Some are good and some are bad, but indeed they form a mosaic and tapestry of our living.

Today, I look 27 years back into the largest, most important fundamental change I have ever experienced. Old ways, viewpoints, and behaviors began to cease, and new alternatives emerged with grateful acceptance. Linear time slowed. Great forces, both the worst and best, were competing for my soul. Alone and wallowing in despair, I became confronted with a decision that would lead to a cruel death or saving grace. It was a time to choose between Yes/ Life or No/Death. Moments were filled with losing loved ones - by divorce and separation. Demonstrable demons tempted for control. I was under attack. Only glimmers of wrongfulness flickered in awareness.

Two forces vied for me: one, the flesh, and the other, the Spirit. Each contested in me: one destroying; the other preserving toward fruitfulness and purpose (Romans 8:13).

As you see today, I live and have been saved. Remembering those harrowing and frightful days remains in sharp focus: the turning point - May 29, 1990 - a clear morning star, bright!

During those early moments and days, calm coolness and savior faire were not on the menu or



on my plate. Hysteria, panic, gloom were marching. I did know one thing, and this probably saved me: I needed help and finally was ready to try anything. I gave up and knew I couldn't fix myself. I turned away from my flesh and prayed Psalm 23. I looked upward towards God.

A lot started happening; too much even to understand until years later. The impact of the Holy Spirit was stunning and all things became new, exciting, invigorating. Old bad behaviors began to slough off and be unlearned. Blessed spiritual truths beat down lies, and knowing their differences started a life-time quest of discovery.

My relationship with God started in earnest and in celebration, drawing each closer together.

One important truth, perhaps the most important, occurred in a dream I had in my first month: If I continued praying, I would not be disappointed (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). I had desired to tell my parents of my "re-birth", my evergrowing new life, and what was happening to me. But it seemed impossible for both had recently passed away. The message in the dream was, "If you continue praying, you will tell all to your parents." At the time it didn't appear shocking but as a common, well-understood fact. It simply was universally accepted truth. I had always known it but had forgotten. Three years later, in another dream, the encounter happened. Praise the Lord! My joy is in my Savior. Glory be to Him.





"513FREE actively works to break the cycle of incarceration by building Christ-centered relationships and programs for those who are: at risk of going, those currently in, and those being released from prison." This mission statement is found on the homepage of 513Free.com when you click on "Overview".

For several years, the Christian band 513Free has been giving concerts at our local prison. As their ministry has grown, they have developed a specific passion to reach those who are in prison through their music, but that's not all. They have given incarcerated individuals an opportunity to share their poetry, stories, art, and teaching with a broadening audience through The Pen Project. They have just released their third volume of "inspiring artwork and creative writings submitted primarily by inmates." Their stated goal is "to make this magazine available to each of the 2.2 million incarcerated men, women, and children throughout the United States."

He formed it to be inhabited

For thus saith the LORD that created the heavens; God Himself that formed the earth and made it; He hath established it, He created it not in vain, He formed it to be inhabited: I am the LORD; and there is none else.

(Isaiah 45:18)

There are those who believe that they can read the supposed evolutionary order of things into the account of creation in Genesis 1. However, when we look more closely, we realize that there are a number of discrepancies, which cannot be reconciled. Even evolutionary atheists have noticed this – for example, Richard Dawkins is adamant that it is not possible to harmonize Genesis with evolution.

One of the most obvious of these discrepancies is that Genesis tells us that God made the Earth before He made all other astronomical objects. The Earth was created on Day One, whereas the greater and lesser lights and the stars were created on the Fourth Day.

The Earth is the focus of God's activity, and in particular the human race, who He has purposed to live here, to have dominion over it. He tells us in Isaiah 45:18 "For thus says the Lord, who created the heavens (he is God!), who formed the earth and made it (he established it; he did not create it empty, he formed it to be inhabited!): 'I am the Lord, and there is no other."

God says "I am the Lord, and there is no other". To prove this to us, if proof were needed, He reminds us not only that He created everything, but that "He formed it to be inhabited". It is through humanity, and therefore, ultimately, through the person of Jesus Christ, that the creation of the Earth has its fulfillment and meaning.


