

Sign-up: Please sign up so we can prepare enough food. You may sign up at the Information Center in the church lobby or call George Schneider to make a reservation.



I'd like to talk about a couple of things that the Pastoral Search Committee has been studying recently.

The first topic are some characteristics that a pastor of a church should have as the shepherd of a local flock of sheep. They are:

- Exemplary character: Titus 1:6-8
- Feed the flock with the Word of God: 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and 4:1-2.
- Desire to our church and community: John 10:10
- · Sacrificially love our church: John 10:11
- · Guard our flock from dangers: Acts 20:28-31
- Point our flock toward a Biblically positive vision: I Peter 1:3-9
- Cares for the lambs who stray: James 5:19-20
 We have asked Paula to send these out on the

prayer chain a couple at a time so you will get reminders to pray over these periodically over the next months.





One in a Million

Has anyone ever told you that you are "one in a million"? An inmate told me recently, "There are 7 billion people in this world, and you are the only one who comes to visit me."

I literally didn't know how to respond. I have been pondering this statement frequently since then...and I still don't know how to respond to it. I keep thinking of the well-known verses in Matthew 25 where Jesus tells of the King who will have a conversation with His servants: They will ask Him, "When did we ever see you sick or in prison and visit you?" And the King will say, "I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to Me!"

Can it be true that I could be the one person in the world who is representing the only One who will never abandon this person? YES! How mindboggling! Could that be true of you? YES! Isn't that an awesome thought!

Every time I go through the prison gates, I pray, "Please empower me to represent You well today." What unforeseen thing will happen? Where will our conversations go? What will be the need, expressed or unexpressed? How can God use me to help someone who is angry, hurting, grieving, bewildered, lonely, frustrated, confused, lost, blind, rebellious?

My dad told me, "I pray each time, 'Lord, You know what these people need; I don't. But please use me in some way to meet that need." I have since "borrowed" his prayer and find it to be so very interesting watching as the Lord answers.

I believe we need to be praying that God will allow us more and more opportunities to watch Him at work, bringing His grace, truth, peace, joy, comfort, and love to suffering individuals. Don't we want to see it happen as we sit across a table or stand in a hallway or parking lot? Don't we want to see it happen at the park or a concert or a restaurant? Don't we feel time is running short? There are 7 billion people out there...surely there must be some who would love to know Jesus Christ, don't you think? Could we, would we be a "one in 7,000,000,000" to someone this year, this month, this week, this day?

What value is music?

"And his brother's name was Jubal: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ." Genesis 4:1`

The Bible tells us that the earliest generations of human beings were making music. By the time the eighth generation of man came along, Jubal, a member of that generation was able to make his living providing musical instruments. On the evolutionary side of things, however, musical ability would seem to provide no survival advantage. Yet, the human brain devotes considerable resources to the processing of music. Our love of music is wired into our brain. Each of our sense organs is important to our enjoyment of music. And each of these organs is linked to its own part of the brain which is responsible for how we experience

Parts of the brain are reserved for memory which stores the music. Other parts of the brain are dedicated to trying to understand the entire piece of music, referencing back to parts of the music stored in the memory. Even more interesting is that one need not hear music to activate the various parts of the brain devoted to music. Positron-emission tomography reveals that a person only needs to imagine music for these portions of the brain to become active. The ability to make or appreciate music offers us no apparent survival value, and therefore, according to evolutionary theory, should not have developed. Yet, our brains, and indeed, all our senses, are designed to make and appreciate music.

The obvious message here is that evolution had nothing to do with the formation of human beings. Rather, we were created by God Who loves music, and wants us to praise Him with music.
