

A Culture of Prayer

I just returned from this year's Interim Pastor's Summit Conference. The central theme was prayer. The speaker was Daniel Henderson who leads a ministry called 6:4 Fellowship. Reverend Henderson's passion is to see churches enhance their effectiveness in prayer. He offered many helpful ideas, but I would like to specifically focus on three of them.

The first one is that *prayer should be* worship-focused rather than request-focused. So often, corporate prayer times begin by taking prayer requests. Nothing is inherently wrong with bringing the needs of life before God. But usually that is where we begin. Instead, worship in prayer through adoration and praise creates the mindset which God desires of his people. We ought to begin with worship of God in prayer because then our dependence upon God is clearly revealed.


Second, prayer in the New Testament church takes place in the community of believers. In our way of thinking, we often think prayer is an individual action, like going into our own personal prayer closet. This way of looking at prayer as primarily a private discipline of the Christian life leaves us unconnected to the larger body of Christ.

Perhaps a person might say, "I don't feel comfortable praying out loud in a small group, much less a large group." But beginning by coming together with one other person with whom you can learn, will build confidence for praying with more people present. The idea of praying only by yourself is counter to examples we have in the book of Acts.

Third, a culture of prayer begins with the church leaders who seriously see prayer as vital to the work of God within the hearts of his people. We do not want to be a church with only "zipper prayers" where we just open and close each meeting or service with a simple prayer. If we wish to see the supernatural work of God take place among us, then we must invite his presence and allow him to do his work in us and through us.

I came away from the conference challenged and convicted that my prayer life is not where it should be. As I continue to serve at Faith Community Church, I want to improve in each of these three areas. Beginning this Sunday, I will begin a short series of messages on prayer. I am sure all of us need to be encouraged in our consistency of meeting with the Lord. May God help us improve our daily communication with him in our personal devotional lives and in a larger setting where we corporately pray in larger groups.




Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!
