<u>Sermon Date</u>: May 3, 2015 <u>Scripture</u>: Ephesians 4:11-14 Speaker: Pastor Mike Jacobson

Opener: Did you have any pets as you were growing up?

Question? Why is it that so many "Christians" are turning from their relationship with God and end up doing things they live to regret?

Question? What connection do "Beliefs" "Values" and "Actions" have to each other?

Question? All around the world Christ-Followers are taking a stand for Christ even if it means loosing their life. What is it about someone that would motive them to do that?

Question? Why is it that so many young people are caving into the negative pressures of peers and society?

Question? Read and discuss - Ephesians 4:13,14

Question? What do you think of the statement: And while we need to fear what our kids could be tempted to do, we need to be more concerned with what our kids are led to believe.

Question? What do we learn from the Israelites regarding taking a stand for truth? What was their downfall? Was it a lack of knowledge?

Question? What is relativism? What are examples of that in our society?

Question? What is a Biblical World-view of life? Is it accurate to say that most people (even "Christians") do not have a Biblical world-view?

Question? What do you think of the statement: There are at least two things that are throwing people off: Wrong beliefs about God and a distorted view of truth

Question? What is absolute truth? Is it proper to set out to live one's life based on absolute truth?

Question? What do you think of the statement: mere believing isn't enough. In fact even believing the "right" things is not enough to keep people from turning their back on Christ.

Question? What does it mean to move from belief to conviction?

Question? Do you recognize the problem in the church with many Christians associating Biblical knowledge with spiritual maturity? Do you see the problem that comes from doing that? Read: I Corinthians 8:1

Question? What do you think of the statement: To have a conviction is to be thoroughly convinced that something is absolutely true. A conviction goes way beyond having a personal preference for something. It is something you would be willing to take a stand for regardless of the consequences.

Question? Read 2 Timothy 1:12 and share the connection Paul made between belief and conviction.

Question? Comment on the following: Belief and convictions are vital, but we must be believing and convinced about the right things.

Question? Is it reasonable to be a Christian? Do you have to put your brain on a shelf to be a Christian?

<u>Question</u> Do you have enough of an understanding of the Bible to dialog with someone from a cult who believes differently?

Question? What does a relationship with God have to do with standing strong in the midst of life's pressures and lies?
