Pastor's Message

In October of 1529, the Holy Roman Empire was attacked. It was unsuccessful but revealed the divisions and weaknesses of the Holy Roman Empire. Just a little over a decade before, on October 31, 1517, Luther nailed the 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg. One could easily say that the Lutherans were responsible for the divisions.

However, Luther and the Lutherans were concerned about one thing. The Gospel. It was being lost in the Church. Bishops and Pastors didn't know basic teachings of the Church, and with the sale of indulgences and the emphasis on doing good works to merit salvation, the Lutherans were right to be concerned about the Church. The division was not in the Lutherans, but in the Church which was preaching and teaching wrong doctrines.

Within a couple of months after the attack on the Holy Roman Empire, Emperor Charles V, against the backdrop of war, called for a theological meeting at Augsburg. In the Emperor's mind, the theological issues had to be addressed in order to unite the German states against the invading Turks. He was concerned that the Holy Roman Empire would be lost. The Lutherans, however, were concerned that something much more important would be lost, namely, the Gospel.

The Lutherans presented the Augsburg Confession at that theological meeting. The heart of that confession, Article IV on Justification, reads as follows: Our churches teach that people cannot be justified before God by their own strength, merits, or works. People are freely justified for Christ's sake, through faith, when they believe that they are received into favor and that their sins are forgiven for Christ's sake. By His death, Christ made satisfaction for our sins. God counts this faith for righteousness in His sight (Romans 3 and 4).

Basically, it puts the correct understanding to faith and works. You are saved by works. But not yours. Jesus did more than die for you. He lived for you. Salvation is not merely the forgiveness of sins. It is the gift of righteousness, received by faith. We receive what He deserves — rewards for His good works — given as a gift. And He received what we deserve because of our deeds — punishment.

God works to save you. He gives you the fruit of His labor by grace. You receive this through faith. This Good News is the focus of the Scriptures. You do nothing. God works. And His works are very good.

Your good works are done in response to salvation. Justification by grace through faith does not mean good works are bad, but puts them in their proper role. We live according to God's will out of thankfulness to His love.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

Advent

During Advent we look forward to the coming of Christ, who is our King. The word "ADVENT" means "coming" and during this season we prepare for Christ's coming as:

- a The baby of Bethlehem.
- b His coming into our hearts and lives.
- c His second coming at the end of time.

Explanation of the blue paraments that are used during Advent. The blue represents Royalty. The Altar: This symbol is a modified Chi Rho. The Chi (X) and the Rho (P) are the first two letters in Greek for the word "Christ". They are often used together in Church symbolism to denote "CHRIST". These altar Paraments tell the story that Jesus, born in the manger in Bethlehem, came to suffer and die for our sins (the three crosses), and now reigns in heaven as our King (crown). The Lectern: The star and the trumpets are announcing the coming of Christ. The Pulpit: The four candles depict the four weeks of Advent when we wait and prepare for the coming of Christ.

Midweek Advent Services are Wednesday, November 30th, December 7th,14th and 21st starting at 6 pm. Handbell Choir practice to follow the service. Midweek Classes for K-6th grades remains at 5 pm as does the Confirmation Class at 7 pm.


