## Pastor's Message

"I don't get anything out of the service." A Lutheran can never say this about our services that we hold at St. Paul.

In our service you hear the Word of God. It is present not only in the readings, but also in the liturgy, as most of our liturgical parts are taken straight from God's Word. It is also present in our hymns. Traditional Lutheran hymns are also confessions of God's Word, and they convey the Gospel. Sermons are also based on God's Word and preach the Gospel. Preaching, likewise, so long as it is the proclamation of the Word of God and not yammering on about pizza or the latest football game.

You cannot say that you don't get anything out of our services because the Word of God is always efficacious. Always.

Isaiah 55:10-11 says, "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it."

Furthermore, it's not just the Word of God. Every Sunday we celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, wherein you receive the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and where there is the forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

In other words, you are getting something out of the service. And not just something. You are getting everything out of the service. You are getting forgiveness, life, and salvation.

When people say they "don't get anything out of the service," they usually mean that they aren't being entertained. And this lust for constant dopamine hits comes from the world, as we are surrounded by 24-7 high-octane on-demand visual and audio stimulation. It's constantly sensual and exciting. To the world, a liturgical service with preaching, hymns, and Holy Communion is a dull affair by comparison.

The best way for the church to exist in a world of dopamine, porn, pop concerts, and light shows is to offer an alternative: authenticity that has been tried and true across the millennia: real worship based on God's preferences rather than our insatiable desire to be the center of attention. We need worship that unites all voices across the range of age demographics and subcultures in a harmonious unity that transcends ephemeral pop trends. At very least, keep the world and its entertainment outside of the nave, and let the church once more be a sanctuary, a holy ark to protect the redeemed from the crafts and assaults of the devil.

For eventually the dopamine hits fail to come, and the "exciting new way of doing church" becomes stale and boring to the self-centered soul. And like an addict, the unsatisfied ego must continue to wander, "not getting anything out of it" and looking for greater titillation elsewhere.

#### Lent

Lent is a season of preparation leading up to Easter. It is the forty days plus the six Sundays before Easter. For centuries, it has been observed as a special time of self-examination and penitence. Lent is a time to recognize what we truly need, and to prepare for the joy of Easter. It is NOT a time to punish ourselves.

#### **Paraments for Lent**

Purple is a color for Royalty and during Lent we think of Jesus, our King, who took our place under the law. Purple is also the color for mourning and sorrow and repentance for our sins.

- Altar: This symbol is a modified Chi Rho. The Chi (X) and the Rho (P) are the first two letters in Greek for the word "Christ". They are often used together in Church symbolism to denote "CHRIST".
- Lectern: Our lamps are always to be lit and ready as we do not know when Christ will come again. The lamp represents the Word of God. (Ps 119:105)
- Pulpit: Jesus is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. (The lamb facing toward the center of the altar and the cross.)

## St. Paul Lutheran Church Quarterly Voter's Meeting Minutes December 11, 2022

(Covers period from Sept 18 to present.)

- 1. Called meeting to order by Chairman Brad Christiansen. 28 members present.
- 2. Opening prayer led by Pastor Varns.
- Minutes from our September quarterly meeting were reviewed. A question was asked on printing the minutes of the quarterly meeting in the next month's newsletter. It was clarified that in the future, the Council would review the minutes at their next monthly meeting and then the minutes could be published in the newsletter.

Motion made to accept mminutes was made by Molly Hoff, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jim Wegner. Motion passed.

- 4. Financial/designated projects reports
  - The Designated SAC account currently has \$1100.54. SAC funds are used for kitchen and serving supplies such as plates, cups, etc. In the past anything over \$500 could be used elsewhere. Motion to move \$500 to the General Fund to reduce the amount currently in SAC was made Mike Brown, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Molly Hoff. Motion passed.
  - The Eternal Light Designated account: The light was purchased for \$1,336 leaving a balance of \$464 which will be used for installation as an electrician will have to pull a new line for it.
  - The Christ candle is broken. New ones available don't fit the current holder. A memorial may possibly be used
    for that.
  - Question was asked concerning the Kirschbaum house under Unrestricted Funds. The account is specified to be
    used as needed but repaid. Following discussion, a motion was made to stop transferring money monthly into
    capital improvement fund as of January 1, 2023 and use the Kirschbaum house fund if there is a need and pay
    that back as soon as possible as a no interest loan. The Designed Capital Improvement Fund will be used until
    it is \$.00.

Motion made by Anne, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Merlin to approval the financial reports. Motion passed.

#### 5. Pastoral report

- Regular activities Sunday morning worship service, recorded, edited, and uploaded; Sunday morning Bible Study, Monday morning 8:00 am men's Bible Study, Thursday morning 9:30 am women's Bible Study, Midweek and confirmation classes 5 pm to 8 pm, visitations.
- Irregular activities Advent services 6 pm on Wednesday. Thursday morning Bible Study was canceled in November. Also, normal visitation schedule has been delayed a couple of weeks as I helped work on the floor.
- There were questions on visiting and Molly H informed us that the Care Center will contact our members and bring them together for Pastor to visit there.

#### 6. Membership Report

- Esther Schmidt died Sept 19; funeral at the church Sept 24.
- Marriage: Rachel Christiansen & Nick Anderson on August 26, 2022, in Glenwood MN

#### 7. Board of Elders

- Christmas Eve Candlelight Service Saturday Dec 24 at 6 pm.
- Sunday Dec 25 Christmas Day service with communion at 9:30 am no bible study.
- Sunday, Jan 1 New Year's Day service with communion at 9:30 am no bible study.

#### Board of Trustees

- Needed is someone to do sidewalk shoveling when there is snow, but not enough for the parking lot to be cleared. For larger amounts, Rob Stengel and crew do the sidewalks. Mike Brown volunteered to shovel the sidewalks for the lighter snowfalls.
- Gene Stengel has purchased a new Mikita robotic vacuum to do floors here at church. This will work for the Parish Hall with chairs put up and the sanctuary and narthex. Thank you, Gene!

#### 9. Special committees

- Social Activities Committee (SAC) chairman is needed yet. This will likely be shared by several people.
- An audit committee is needed for our books and volunteers for this are Sue Erickson, Gene Stengel, Dan Enninga and Dennis Smith.

#### 10. New business:

- Theresa Luepke has resigned as treasurer and Anne Brown has agreed to complete Theresa's term. Motion made for Anne to be treasurer for the current term made by Carol G, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol Podratz. Motion passed.
- Otto Luepke has resigned so we now have 3 trustees.
- Next year elections will be held in March and open positions are for elder, VP, secretary & trustee. Be thinking of these positions and if you would like to volunteer or encourage someone else
- Proposed budget:
  - a. Motion made to approve \$21,000 housing allowance for Pastor for 2023 made by Gene S., 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dan Enninga. Motion passed.
  - b. Lay people: The large financial increase in outdoor yardman is for snow removal.
  - c. Church and office decease: postage is down due to not mailing the newsletter. Worship supplies: decrease the number Portals of Prayer; discontinued Creative Worship; decreased the number of bulletins; and no kids activities sheets each Sunday.
  - d. Christian Education: VBS is currently not being done. Lutheran Island Camp is no longer providing this service.
  - e. Care of God's House: Natural gas, water and electric are all anticipating rising amounts. Capital improvements will zero out now.
  - f. Insurance: Property insurance is up but \$8100 is an estimate allowing for an estimated increase.
  - f. Missions: MN North District: Clarification was made if this amount is a portion of our income for the year. We do decide the amount to be used for district purposes. Circuit assessment: Used for district conferences and conventions for Pastor. Discretionary missions: for people contacting the church asking for help. Suggestion is made to have gift cards available for gas, etc.

Motion to approve the 2023 budget made by Phyllis Schultz, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mike Brown. Motion passed.

#### 11. Announcements:

- Cancellation policies for weather printed in December's newsletter (If YME school closes, our church activities do not take place).
- Board of Elder/Council mtgs are Tues, Jan. 10<sup>th</sup>.
