# Pastor's Message

Why on earth would you, a busy person, want to sacrifice what little R&R time you have to attend public worship regularly? Those who attend public worship regularly do so because they believe they are gaining much

more than they are giving up. Consider the following:

1. If you knew that Jesus Himself was going to be at a particular place on a regular basis, would you not be motivated to go? The local Christian congregation is that place. Christians gather publicly to be with their risen Savior. The Lord Himself is present as He promises "For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them" (Mt. 18:20). Further, Scripture calls Christians assembled together, "the body of Christ." In other words, the answer to the question, "Where can I find Jesus today?" is "Where Christians gather" for they are His body.

2. Jesus is there primarily to give forgiveness to all who repent and believe. Proclaiming the forgiveness that Jesus won for us on the cross is the main point of all Christian worship services. God comes not to receive our praise but to give the forgiveness of sins through the preaching of the

Gospel, Absolution, and the Lord's Supper.

3. Never before have people been confronted with so many voices or choices. All the more reason to go to church regularly. For there the voice of God Himself speaks to us through sermon, Scripture, liturgy, and hymnody. God speaks to His people guiding them into truth, reminding them of what is

right, warning them about what is wrong.

- 4. Private study of God's Word is wonderful, it must not be a substitute for hearing the preached Word. The Pastor, who holds the divinely appointed preaching office, is, by God's will, the chief teacher of God's Word, the one through whom Christ Himself speaks (see Lk 10:16; Eph 4:11-16; I Tim 4:13-16; II Tim 4:1-5; Heb 13:17). Furthermore, he has gone through extensive study so as to become a "specialist" in God's Word. He has learned the original languages and spent many years in prayer and study learning God's Word.
- 5. According to Scripture we are reminded that "man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord" (Deut 8:3; Mt 4:4). God's Word is food for the soul. Public worship is the best place to give your soul the Word-of-God-nourishment it needs. In another place Jesus says, "Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you" (Jn 6:27). How tragic to see people zealously provide for their bodies but not their souls.
- 6. We all have troubles. Life can be cruel in a fallen world. What God said of Adam applies to us all: "It is not good for man to be alone." Why bear your burdens alone? Coming to church means interacting with your fellow Christians, the body of Christ. It means receiving an encouraging word, a hug and a smile. It means having someone listen. More profoundly, it is often through His body that Christ speaks the comfort and crucial direction that we need. How often a timely word of Gospel by one Christian to another dispels the gloom and gives a spiritual insight that benefits another—be loved and encouraged.
