Pastor's Message

"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His mercy endures forever." – Psalm 136:1

November is often called the month of thanksgiving. The fields are cut and tilled after the harvest. The trees stand bare. Families gather around tables, and we pause to reflect on the many ways God has blessed us. It's a season of gratitude.

And yet, giving thanks is not always easy. Life doesn't always feel "good." There are worries that keep us awake at night, empty places at the table, and health troubles that remind us how fragile we are. Some days are filled with more questions than answers. In those moments, "give thanks" can sound like a command we're too tired to follow.

That's why the psalmist's words are so important: "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His mercy endures forever." Notice what it says—and what it doesn't. We're not told to give thanks because everything in our lives is good, but because the Lord is good. His mercy doesn't come and go with the seasons. It doesn't depend on how we feel or how well things are going. His goodness stands firm even when everything else around us shifts and changes.

We see that goodness most clearly in Jesus Christ. When we were lost in sin, He came to save us. When we were unworthy, He covered us with His righteousness. When we were powerless, He laid down His life on the cross and rose again to give us eternal life. The mercy that endures forever has a name and a face—Jesus, our Savior.

That is the foundation of real thanksgiving. The world gives thanks when things go well. Christians give thanks because we know that in Christ, God is for us, even when life is hard. His forgiveness still stands. His promises still hold. His love does not fade. So we can give thanks in plenty and in want, in joy and in sorrow, knowing that our God is faithful in all things.

Every breath we take, every meal on the table, every act of kindness, every moment of forgiveness—these are gifts from our Father's gracious hand. But above them all stands His greatest gift: His Son, who has secured for us eternal life and peace with God. That is gratitude that lasts—thanksgiving that no circumstance can take away.

So as the days grow shorter and the year draws to its close, take time to pause and remember the Giver behind every gift. Give thanks for daily bread, for family and friends, for the fellowship of Christ's Church, and above all, for the steadfast mercy of your Savior.
