Pastor's Message

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." — John 1:14

December often feels like a tug-of-war. One part of us aches for peace and stillness—the soft glow of Advent candles, the hush of winter evenings, the deep sigh that comes with singing Advent hymns. We long for quiet hearts and unhurried moments.

But another part of us is dragged in every possible direction. Lists multiply. Calendars fill. School programs, work deadlines, winter storms, and family expectations all converge at the same time. Even the good things—the joy of giving, the beauty of worship, the anticipation of Christmas Eve—can come with a whisper of worry: "What if I forget something? Am I falling behind? Am I ready for any of this?"

Into this swirl of the hustle and bustle, St. John speaks a word older than creation and stronger than our chaos: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us."

St. John's sentence reaches all the way back to Israel's wilderness. The Greek verb for "dwelt" means "pitched His tent," "tabernacled," or "set up His dwelling." Just as the LORD placed His tent in the center of Israel's camp so that sinners would know He was near—not distant, not aloof—so now the eternal Son of God steps directly into the center of our world. He doesn't wait for peace and order. He doesn't wait for humanity to clean up its act. He brings His presence right into the noise, the exhaustion, the sin, and the unfinished business of real life.

This is the wonder that Advent invites us to ponder: The God who filled the tabernacle with glory now fills human flesh with His presence. He "moves into the neighborhood." He puts on our skin, carries our weakness, shares our tears, and shoulders our burdens.

And that is the Gospel of Christmas: God comes all the way to us. Not halfway. Not almost. Not "close enough." All the way. A stable. A manger. A weary mother. A worried carpenter. A world stumbling in darkness.

This is where Christ chooses to begin His saving work—right in the thick of human need. Christmas is not humanity climbing to God; Christmas is God stooping down, bending low, entering in, and refusing to let sin or sorrow have the last word.

So if this December finds you anxious, distracted, grieving, or stretched thin—if your strength is small and your list is long—hear this comfort: Christ is not far from you. Christ has come with His grace and mercy.

For the Child in the manger is also the Man of the cross. The One wrapped in swaddling cloths will later be wrapped in burial cloths— and then will rise from the dead, so that nothing can separate you from the Father's love. Romans 5:8 says, "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Council Notes


The monthly Church Council meeting for December is on the 9th at 7 pm.
