Pastor's Message

When the Lights Feel Dim

January can be a hard month. The decorations are packed away. The weather is cold. The days are still short. Christmas joy can feel far behind us, and ordinary life presses back in—work, school, bills, worries, and unfinished problems.

So here's a simple question: What happens to your faith when the light feels dim? That question sits right at the heart of Epiphany, the season that fills much of January. Epiphany means “appearing” or “revealing.” It reminds us that God's light shines—not only on Christmas night, but especially when life feels dark and ordinary.

Isaiah writes, “Arise, shine, for your light has come” (Isaiah 60:1). But January rarely feels like a shining season.

Here is the malady: when life feels ordinary, dull, difficult, or heavy, we assume God must be distant. Quietly, we think, If God were really close, wouldn't I feel more joyful? More hopeful? More at peace?

That assumption shows up in tired prayers, distracted worship, and the sense that faith is something we must strain to keep alive.

Isaiah does not say, “Arise and shine because you feel bright.” He says, “Your light has come.” In the Hebrew, the verb points to something already accomplished. God's light arrives first. Our response comes later.

That is how God always works. The Magi in Matthew 2 did not follow a feeling. They followed a star—steady, visible, and given by God. Before electric lights, even a small flame mattered. One candle could change a whole room. Light did not need to be overwhelming; it simply needed to be real. That is a helpful picture for a “January” faith.

Here is the Gospel comfort: Jesus does not shine only when we feel strong, but He especially shines for us when we feel weak.

Christ is the Light who entered real darkness: a broken world, suffering people, and finally the cross. On Good Friday, it looked as though the light had gone out completely. Yet that was the very moment our salvation was being won.

Jesus forgives our dull faith. He covers our cold hearts. He keeps His promises even when our feelings lag behind.

As the Epiphany hymn prays: “Brightest and best of the sons of the morning, Dawn on our darkness and lend us Thine aid.” And He does.

So what does this mean for us this month? It means we do not measure God's presence by our mood. We do not judge our faith by how inspired we feel. We return to where Christ promises to shine—His Word, His forgiveness, His gifts.

A small light is still light. A quiet promise is still a promise. And Christ is still with you. January may feel dim—but the Light has come, and He is not going anywhere.


