G'day from the Sunshine Coast

"I hope all is well state-side! I want to thank you so much for your interest and support of what God is doing in and through my life here in Australia. I attended the September Discipleship Training School and headed out on Outreach on November 24th for two months. God has been good and he has been teaching me so much about patience and faithfulness particularly in the area of pressing on and carrying out what He has said in obedience despite circumstances or how we feel. It was exciting to be in Rote, Indonesia working again with my good friend I met over there last time, Pastor Yefta. We stayed at the base run by him and his family sharing our faith in local schools, preaching at home churches and church buildings, reaching out to remote villages, traveling throughout the country and camping out of a big truck. I've been teaching my team some basic fire spinning which we intend to use for street performances and as an option for bigger crowds and audiences. Should be lots of fun but prayers for their safety would be very appreciated."


