

Moment's Reflection

"The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness." -Exodus 16:2

Question. Read the passage from Exodus again and tell me which detail is more important to understanding the story.

A. Moses and Aaron are good leaders and the people are complaining?



B. The Israelites have just experienced a seismic change in their lives?

And the answer is? B. Despite Moses and Aaron's otherwise capable leadership, the people still complain, and on the surface of it, their complaining seems unwarranted. Whatever happened or didn't happen, couldn't have been so significant that "the whole congregation of Israelites" was compelled to rise up in arms.

But as I said, that's not the most important detail in the story. That they "complained" is interesting and noteworthy and probably deserving of attention. But the better question is "why?" And not only "why", but "why now"? And the answer? The Israelites are complaining now because no matter how glad they are to finally be free of Pharaoh, they've experienced a seismic change in their whole way of life. They've gone from city dwellers to wilderness wanders, from flesh-pot eaters to manna-gathers.

In his books on healthy congregations, Peter Steinke emphasizes the importance of "non-anxious presence." Non-

anxious leaders, he says, have the capacity to stand in an anxious, changing moment and not be reactive. It's much harder than you think. Much as we laud our relative sophistication, we're still like our Neanderthal ancestors: we're wired for flight or fight responses. As leaders, for instance, in any venue of work or home, we're likely to react to a complaint in a fight or flight way, never taking the time to understand the meaning of another's predisposing feeling.

You already know this principle intuitively. You're on a crowded freeway during drive time, and the driver behind you swerves around you. You could take the move personally as a sign that the driver is making a judgment on your driving ability, or the car you're driving, or the fact that he's young and you're old. Or, you could remind yourself the more likely truth that his actions are indicative of his emotional/mental state of being.

As we gather Sunday to celebrate our church's 141st anniversary, it seems to me that our church is experiencing a lot of change. From Ray's retirement, to Allison's recent resignation. To the passing of many beloved members to the emergence of a younger generation with new needs, to a proposal to restructure our church's governance to dynamics in your personal life which have significantly restructured the way you live, we are, in some sense, a whole congregation of people in the wilderness. We'd be less than human if, in the midst of all these changes, we didn't spend some time complaining. Yet, the challenge is two-fold. To those who do the complaining, take a few minutes to take stock of what's happening in your life. To those who hear the complaining, resist the impulse to personalize and react. Take a few minutes to consider "why now?" -Dan



FUSION: a merging of spirituality into real everyday life

The basic purpose of Fusion is to provide space and time to consistently connect with one another and God. Its goal is to help "fuse" (meld, unite, weave) our faith and spirituality into all aspects of our lives.



This Fall, Fusion will develop into a small group ministry to nurture deeper connections in an authentic and comfortable way. In an effort to meet people where they are, Fusion will be hosted in homes at whatever day and time is most convenient for each individual small group. Groups are encouraged to commit to gathering on a regular basis to promote accountability and ongoing support of one another. Most gatherings will involve sharing a meal, yet, these meals will be kept simple and low stress. The core group of adults should not grow larger than about 12-14 people (6-7 couples). New groups will be formed as needed.

It should be a time for adults and children alike to spend time sharing life and prayer. Children are welcome to attend and will be encouraged to play with their friends in an adjacent room after dinner.

In keeping with the "low stress" theme, the format of the gatherings will be casual and free-flowing. The focus is not on accomplishing a set agenda or engaging in an extensive bible study, rather emphasis will be placed on being present and engaged.


