MOMENT'S REFLECTION

Be cheerful no matter what; pray all the time; thank God, no matter what happens. This is the way God wants you who belong to Christ Jesus to live. -1 Thessalonians 5:17-18

I've always thought Paul was a little over the top in his words to the Thessalonians. Give encouragement? Yes. But make people feel bad for feeling bad? I don't know.



Church there had its hopes set high on Jesus' second coming. But when weeks turned to months, and some of the beloved charter members passed away, discontent set in. Seems these Christians were equipped for hard work, even persecution. They just weren't prepared to work hard, suffer persecution, indefinitely.

Their situation recalls a beloved, yet curmudgeonly, Stewardship Chair in another church. I twisted his arm into doing a job he wasn't totally sold on doing. After weeks of cajoling, I finally won him over by suggesting, "John, a campaign only lasts a few weeks. Give it your best for a while, and then you'll be done. You can do it." He tried hard. But in the days following our church's pledge Sunday, after several evenings of follow-up visits, he called to report: "Pastor, I've been good for over three weeks now. I don't have any more nice in me."

Truth is, being nice takes effort for all of us. And it's rarely convenient. My friend John was probably a little less predisposed to it, but having a good attitude, saying positive words, cultivating nice thoughts and actions—this is a discipline. I'd say it's even a spiritual discipline.

Did you read the story, see the picture, about the sign on the Pope's office door? It reads, "Vietato Lamentarsi." In any language that means: "NO WHINING!" That's what he said. No whining. In smaller print the sign continues: "Transgressors are subject to a syndrome of victimization and the ensuing reduction of a sense of humor and capacity to resolve problems. Sanctions are doubled when the violation is committed in the presence of children."

None of us knows the troubles he's seen. Thank God for that! In recent weeks, the Vatican's auditor general resigned, its treasurer returned to Australia to face trial for sex abuse and its top doctrine official was dismissed.

I know. You have your troubles, too. Neither Paul nor I are minimizing them. But, together with the Pope I'm asking that you do more than whine about them. In fact, Paul says spend some time praying and thanking God for what's right with your life.


