

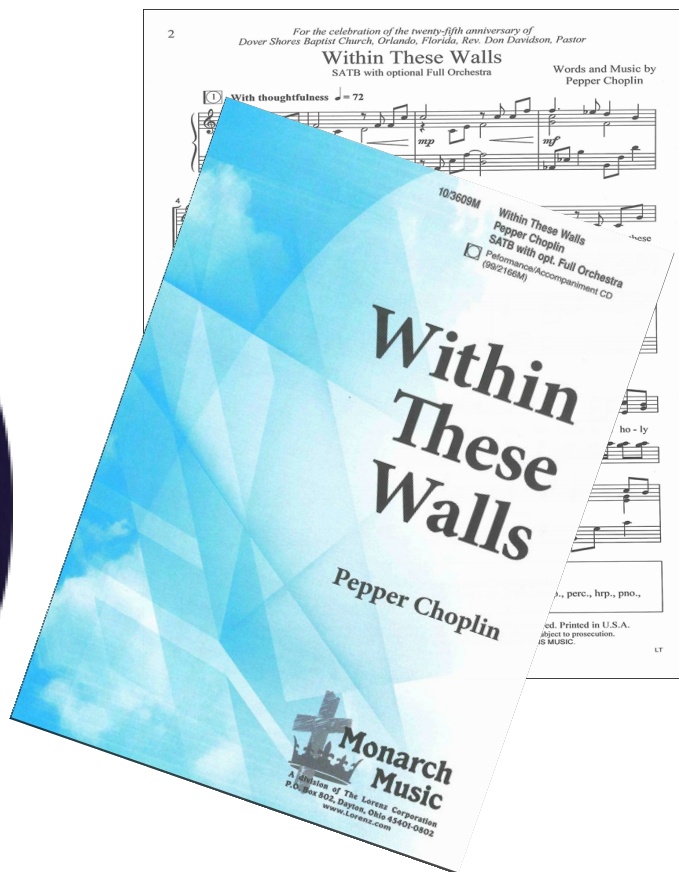

Moment's Reflection

"When his disciples saw it, they said 'Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?'"
- Luke 9:54

Where did that come from? Harsh words like that? Were James and John in a bad mood? Luke says Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. Along the way he and the disciples went through a Samaritan village. But the people there wouldn't receive him. Jesus was willing to let it go. James and John weren't. They were ready to unleash Armageddon. I have a feeling those words, that willingness to act in hostility, had taken root long before that moment in a Samaritan village.

A friend of mine, a person of color, said he walked into a store a few months ago. He was waiting in line, and a customer, a white person, cut in front of him. My friend is an extraordinarily patient person, but he says he felt a rush of anger towards that rude customer he didn't know he had in him. On the way home he kept asking himself, "Where did that come from?"

After considerable reflection, he thinks he knows. For years, he's grown up in small, southern towns. He's been the recipient of what he calls "micro-aggressions." Hundreds of them. Little puts downs. Patronizing dismissals. Negative characterizations. His parents always told him to turn the other cheek. As a matter of survival, they taught him to be silent, not to react. But the cumulative effect of a lifetime of these little insults has eaten away at him. That moment in the store, with the rude white customer cutting in front of him, triggered a pent-up lifetime of having been put down. He said, "I realized later that I'd spent a lifetime harboring this idea, this impression, rightly or not, that white people feel entitled. That they don't see people like me. Or if they do, they don't respect people like me. I suppose," he confessed, "that even though I never said it aloud, the corrosive effect of that thought worked on my soul."

One of my colleagues writes a weekly blog. In one of his recent blogs he included a quote that struck me in an especially powerful way. I don't know exactly who first wrote these words, but I know from a life of experience that they're true.

"Watch your thoughts, they become words.

Watch your words, they become actions.

Watch your actions, they become habits.

Watch your habits, they become character.

Watch your character, for it becomes your destiny."

So where did that come from? If James and John had thought about it, they would've known.

The seeming impulse to fire-bomb a Samaritan village was rooted in a long-held thought that Samaritans were bad people. Watch your thoughts. They are the seeds of action.

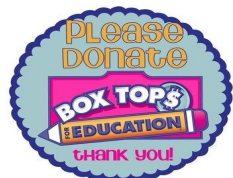

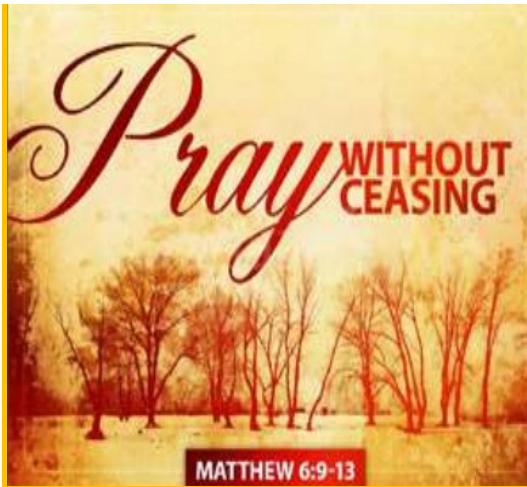

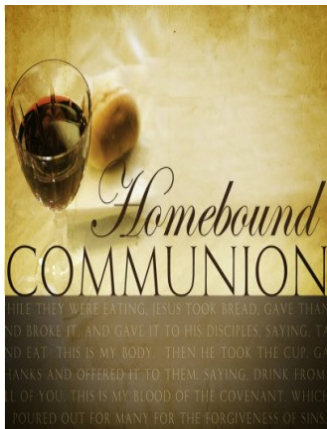
