MOMENT'S REFLECTION

"To all the saints who are in {Garland} and are faithful in Christ Jesus." -Ephesians 1:1



Casey, David and I want to thank you for the flowers you gave in our honor this past Sunday (October 28). The relationship between a church and its pastors is like no other. In walking the journey of faith together, we share sickness and health, times of richness and poverty, myriad occasions that are both better and worse. As in any covenantal relationship the passage of time tends to make the extraordinary, ordinary. We take for granted the relationships, the community, that mean the most of to us. Sometimes, its good to say what we generally assume: that we have regard, appreciate and love one another.

Paul once admonished his parishioners at the Christian Church in Rome. "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep." In the church, we tend to excel at

being with each other in times of sorrow, sadness and loss. We sometimes overlook the opportunities to rejoice in and with one another.

We confess. We nearly overlooked your kindness. In our concern to preside over Sunday worship, we almost missed it. Only later that afternoon, did we see it. The words in the bulletin:

"**Sanctuary Flowers**. In loving honor and with grateful appreciation to our pastors—Dr. Dan Jones, Rev. Casey Tanguay, and David Ware—from the congregation of First Christian Church Garland."

From your ministerial staff, thank you. We want you to know that we honor and appreciate you, too.

In his book, This People, This Parish, long-time pastor Robert Hudnut writes:

"I went into the pulpit one Sunday and there it was. Someone had rolled up a piece of cardboard and on it had written, 'We love you.' I will never know who it was. No one has claimed authorship The pastor could just as well put a sign on the front of the pulpit saying, 'I love you.' In sense, that is all the pastor does—loves the people."

Hudnut continues: "It is generally the most loving churches which have the most members giving their money to jails, nursing homes, slums, schools and mission outposts. And it is generally the most loving churches which reach out to their own members at times of distress, such as death and divorce and job-loss and emotional crisis."

You excel in all these things. By every measure, you are a loving congregation. The flowers you gave Sunday were a gracious reminder. They were a symbol of the love that binds our hearts. --Your Pastors, Dan, Casey & David, All Saints 2018






Thanksgiving Food Bags


