MOMENT'S REFLECTION

I miss you. You used to be a regular attender on Sunday morning. Sometimes even before the coffee had brewed, you were here, coursing through the building. Greeting people. Catching up on stories. Filing through the narthex at the end of service to greet me.

I don't see you as often now. I wonder where you've been. How your life is. Where God is in your journey of faith.

Sometimes I see you at the store. You're always so friendly. We talk as if nothing has changed. Pick up on the old stories that bind us together. You smile and tell me you're fine. The family, too. They're all fine. I remember when your kids were little. So, it pleases me when, standing there at the check-out stand, you tell me all about them. The oldest is married. The youngest, the one who used to tell me stories about her favorite kind of ponies—chestnut, cream color, the spotted ones that you told me are called "Appaloosa"—she's in college now. Plans to be an animal doctor. I'm not surprised. Talking with you, I remember how close your family's life used to be intertwined with the church. But once you and I leave the store we both know it'll be only chance that brings us back together again.

You aren't the only ones I miss. I miss some of the pillars of the church who've passed on. I can still see the places they used to sit on Sunday morning, and sometimes when I'm writing a sermon, I still see their faces, recall some of the conservations. I miss the ones who've moved away, too. Or the ones for whom life changed and much as I wanted so badly for them to stay and never leave, those of us who loved them knew it was time. I miss the ones who don't have the physical vigor to come.



But you're the one I can't get out of my mind on Sunday morning. Sometimes you call to tell me that a loved one is in the hospital. I hear a hint of apology in your voice, as you ask if I'll come have prayer. "I know I haven't been to church much lately." And I tell you that it doesn't matter, because if you knew a pastor's heart, you'd understand that it really doesn't matter. I love you unconditionally. I'll pray for you whether you come to church or not.

But I miss you. Your presence matters to me. I'll be there when you call. I'll look forward to the times when we see each other at the store. I'll enjoy the little updates. But I want you to know that none of these things replaces you being here Sunday morning.

Barry Talley grew up in West Texas, graduating from West Texas State University in 1980. He is now the Executive Director of Fine Arts for the Deer Park Independent School District located in the Houston area. He served as the Choral Director at Deer Park High School for thirty-five years before moving into full time administration in 2015. He is in his 37th year as Music Director at the Deer Park United Methodist Church.

Barry has always been an active writer and arranger of choral music. He has over 50 songs and arrangements to his credit with publishers including Hal Leonard and Alliance. He has written commissioned works for both churches and schools in Texas.

He is one of three brothers who chose choral music as their vocation. The Talley Boys made their mark in music in different areas of the state. Randy, the eldest brother (though he does not like to admit that) taught most of his career in the Odessa area. Billy, the middle brother (considered by some to be the smartest), retired in 2017 from Tascosa High School in Amarillo where he spent over 30 years of his teaching career. Both Randy and Billy are former presidents of the Texas Choral Directors Association. The Talley Boys have sung all over the state including appearances with Larry Gatlin.

Barry served as the President of the Texas Music Educators Association in 2000-2001. The Texas Choral Directors Association honored him as a recipient of the Choral Excellence Award in 2013.


